RENO, Nev. – The stage is set for an incredible conclusion to the 2021 Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour season, with three titles, a major championship and postseason honors being determined during the next week at the PWBA Fall Classic Series.

The Fall Classic Series, which will feature the final three events of the 2021 season, will get underway Sunday at the National Bowling Stadium with the official practice session for the PWBA Reno Classic (Oct. 25-26), PWBA Pepsi Clas-

sic (Oct. 27-28) and PWBA Tour Championship (Oct. 29-31), the third major of the year.

The finals of the PWBA Tour Championship will be broadcast live Oct. 31 at 5 p.m. Eastern on CBS Sports Network, with the winner taking home a \$50,000 top prize.

All qualifying and match-play rounds, including the stepladder finals of the Reno Classic and Pepsi Classic, will be broadcast on BowlTV.com. The winner of each event will earn \$10,000.

The battle for PWBA Player of the Year ultimately may come down to the title match during the Tour Championship, with six players within 13,400 points of Ukraine's Dasha Kovalova.

Kovalova enters the Fall Classic Series at the top of the season-long points list (110,380), which determines

PWBA Player of the Year.

Two-time reigning PWBA Player of the Year Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, is second with 108,145 points, and England's Verity Crawley is third with 106,100.

Three-time PWBA Player of the Year Liz Johnson of Niagara Falls, New York, is in the mix for the award once again with 100,710 points, while Julia Bond of Aurora, Illinois (100,370), Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York (97,495), and Missy Parkin of Laguna Hills, California (97,012.5), all look to win the award for the first time.

Kovalova has ascended to the top of the points list this season on the strength of two wins and six championship-round appearances.

The 26-year-old right-hander also has experienced some

I covered two versions of this event for The Bowling News and Bowlers Journal International, the first hosted by Terrell Owens at Main Event in Katy on Super Bowl Sunday 2017 (you know, the one Johnny Hanna still can't

Team USA Sweeps Team, All-Events Gold Medals at 2021 PANAM Bowling Elite Championships

CALI, Colombia - Team USA may have been slow out of the gates this week at the 2021 PANAM Bowling Elite Championships, but the tournament ended perfectly, with the men and women sweeping the team and all-events gold medals.

Both teams entered the second half of the team event at the top of the standings, and

both faltered early in Friday's three-game block, before regaining their composure and momentum to earn their spots atop the podium.

The Team USA men were the first to strike gold Friday at the 20-lane Bolera Departamental. They outlasted Canada to secure the title for the third consecutive time, this time averaging more than 207 as a team over the six games.

After Thursday's three games, Team USA held a 27-pin advantage over the Canadians but lost the lead after the opening game Friday, shooting 969 to Canada's 1,088.

Led by left-hander Matt Russo, who posted a 1,335 total for his six team games, Team USA bounced back with 1,082 and 1,028 for a 6,212 total. Canada finished with 6,052 to take the silver medal, and Costa Rica earned the bronze with 5,845. The event included 13 men's teams.

Russo was joined in the victory by Kristopher Prather (1,255), Kyle Sherman (1,241), Nick Pate (1,227) and Andrew Anderson (1,154). Cameron Crowe also joined Team USA on the lanes, but his 1,210 total did not count toward the team score.

"I knew it all wouldn't really hit us until we got up there on the podium and heard the start of the national anthem," Russo said. "This whole trip has been a lot of fun. I truly enjoy bowling with these guys. We're great friends, too, and I think that really helped with the communication. We also know each other's games well, and that definitely made it easier. It has been a dream of mine since I can remember to be out here winning medals, and there's nothing like it."

The Team USA women had a clearer path to the gold medal.

They led the eight-team field by 241 pins after Thursday's

three games and extended that to 362 after six games. They topped the standings with a 6,093 total. They won the team title in Cali in 2014 and finished second to Colombia in 2016 and 2018.

Bryanna Coté had the hot hand for the United States, leading the way with a 1,286 total. She was followed by Breanna

Clemmer (1,259), Lauren Pate (1,224), Julia Bond (1,168) and Gazmine Mason (1,156). Sydney Brummett also was on the lanes for Team USA, but her 1,028 total did not count toward the team score.

Mexico closed with a 1,025 game to surge into second place, earning the silver medal

talk about with his Atlanta Falcons blowing a 3rd quarter 28 - 3 lead, as Sandi Charles often likes to remind him), and the November 2017 Chris Paul event at Bowlero The Woodlands.

Much like Celebrity Bowling did, these two-hour events feature celebrities interacting as themselves among each other, as they would even without an average of 1.363 million viewers watching.

Oh yeah, the viewers. PBA Commissioner Tom Clark told me last week the viewership numbers were great, adding the lowest number of viewers at any one point was more than one million, the highest was around two million. In addition, the Nielsen numbers indicated the key 18 to 49 year-old viewership on the main Fox Network was 467,000, good for a 0.74 rating, a great number going against one of several late afternoon NFL games on CBS.

The ratings of the game on CBS on at the same time did ok as the most watched NFL game of the week with the team (the one that plays by The Bowling Campus in Arlington) winning its game against New England averaged over 25 million viewers. I'll gladly take the million plus for a PBA telecast.

Oh yeah, there was the lead in programming. Eight NFL games starting at Noon

Central on both Fox and CBS straddled an average of fifteen million viewers. Those not needing a late afternoon NFL matchup, perhaps waiting for the Sunday night game (featuring the team John Burkett and I prefer, the Steelers), had an average viewership of over 16.25 million. So yes, the PBA has drawn noteworthy Nielsen numbers in what has become an annual late Sunday afternoon spot on Fox the PBA has had the last few years.

The ratings, especially those of the key 18 to 49 year-old viewers on the main Fox Network, allows the PBA to display itself to prospective sponsors of both tournaments and telecast airtime. One example is Guaranteed Rate, who is now the tour's title sponsor for the 2022 season, a sponsor not thought of showing its service to bowling fans even as recent as five years ago. Once the PBA Tour telecasts resume in January, I will have another column listing the commercial content of one of the shows, mentioning recent and newer commercial content, then analyzing why news sponsors bought airtime. You'd be surprised how many companies and businesses are seen on PBA telecasts for the first time in recent years, something we haven't seen in thirty years when ABC's Pro Bowlers Tour was a Saturday afternoon staple.

Oh yeah, this is also a PBA tryout for getting new viewers. With easily recognizable celeb-

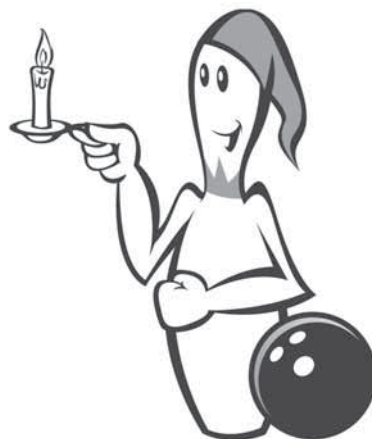
rities, often from entertainment and music, who enjoy bowling and know how to put on a good show gives the casual viewer a reason not to surf other channels. You think ESPN was going to do this? Probably not.

Many different ingredients came together to create the momentum we have seen, even through the pandemic. Tom Clark got different show formats to show off player skills and personalities. Remember how we first thought about going to Portland, Maine and how crazy that sounded at the

time? Now players and fans alike can't wait to experience in person the energy of Charlie Mitchell's BowlPortland during the PBA League. High tech graphics showing ball motion appear on Fox telecasts during each strike ball. The score bug in one bottom left corner of the screen shows the last four frame line score. The Tournament of Champions is back at AMF Riviera in suburban Akron, Ohio for 2022 as it has for most of the last few years, its only home from 1966 to 1994. Former reality television star and PBA COO Colie Edison has positioned The Association as a force on the sports hierarchy ladder to a much more recognizable brand than it was trying to be thirty years ago. The list of celebrities to be included in a CP3 event is greater than available spots.

The one key element to all this falling into place was getting the Fox Television contract. Perhaps I should say Fox wanting the PBA in its list of sports viewing options. Knowing how Fox was the catalyst is the latest evolution in sports television is presented started with the NFL thirty years ago, it was ahead of the curve with more and more on-screen information, making more information trendy.

Thankfully, we are at a point where the question, "What's next?" doesn't infer gloom and doom, but instead being ready the next "I'm glad I saw that" moment.

on ways to create better motion through the pins and become more familiar with her arsenal.

"I've been living in the bowling alley the past two months," said Kovalova, a four-time PWBA Tour champion. "I think the people who stay at Brunswick after hours will start telling urban legends about that one girl who's always there. I've been practicing a lot. I've been working on staying behind the ball more, because my spin-y release sometimes affects my carry. When I have my wrist behind the ball, it's better."

The format for the Reno Classic and Pepsi Classic will feature two six-game blocks of qualifying, with the top 12 athletes advancing to round-robin match play. Match play also will consist of two six-game rounds, with the top four players, based on total pinfall and bonus pins, advancing to the stepladder finals.

The top 24 players after 24 games of qualifying from the Reno Classic and Pepsi Classic will qualify for the Tour Championship. Pinfall will drop at the start of the Tour Championship, and all competitors will bowl 24 games of round-robin match play. The top five will advance to the finals, based on total pinfall and bonus pins.

Kovalova has been one of the top performers during the season's two previous Classic Series events, making three championship-round appearances in six tournaments.

"I think what I've liked about these events is that it's a marathon," Kovalova said. "I tend to be less anxious, because I know that there's a lot of games, and one bad one won't necessarily affect it in a crucial way. I know I can survive the longer events because I've been working on my stamina. I like the longevity of the format, and the previous events have

showed me the range of patterns we could have, too."

In the race for PWBA Rookie of the Year, Stephanie Zavala of Downey, California, enters the Fall Classic Series with a 15,050-point lead over Breanna Clemmer of Clover, South Carolina.

Zavala won two of her first five events as a PWBA member, recording wins at the PWBA Greater Cleveland Open and PWBA BVL Open. She increased her lead heading into the Fall Classic Series after

making her fourth championship-round appearance of the year at the U.S. Women's Open, finishing in fourth place.

Reno and the NBS are hosting the PWBA for the second time during the 2021 season. The United States Bowling Congress Queens was contested at the 78-lane venue in May, with Bond winning her first major and second career title over Parkin in the title match, 238-154.

struggles during the 2021 season, which started in January and already has featured 17 events.

with a 5,731 effort. Puerto Rico took the bronze with 5,683.

The end of the team event also determined this year's all-events medalists, as well as which countries qualified for the 2022 World Games and 2022 International Bowling Federation World Cup.

Russo, who is engaged to Lauren Pate, averaged nearly 212 across the four events (singles, doubles, trios, team) and 24 games to claim the top spot in the all-events standings with a 5,078 total.

The silver medal went to Russo's future brother-in-law Nick Pate (4,996), and Canada's Mitch Hupé took home the bronze medal (4,928).

Team USA's Sherman finished fifth (4,865), Prather was sixth (4,862), Crowe was 12th (4,735) and Anderson was 24th (4,616).

Clemmer set the pace on the women's side, averaging 207.96. She claimed the all-events gold medal with a 4,991 total. She also won doubles this week with Lauren Pate and grabbed a bronze medal in trios with Pate and Mason.

Mexico's Iliana Lomeli shot 280 in her final game to catapult herself to the silver medal with a 4,910 total. The bronze medal went to Coté with 4,856.

Team USA's Pate finished fifth (4,784), Bond was sixth (4,764), Mason was 21st (4,441) and Brummett was 33rd (4,231).

"This was my first tournament with adult Team USA, and I was pretty nervous, but I just tried to stick to my process and be with the girls as much as possible," said Clemmer, who also enjoyed a decorated career with Junior Team USA. "In a sense, I was a veteran in the group, but I tried to learn from each and every one of my

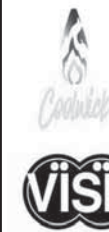

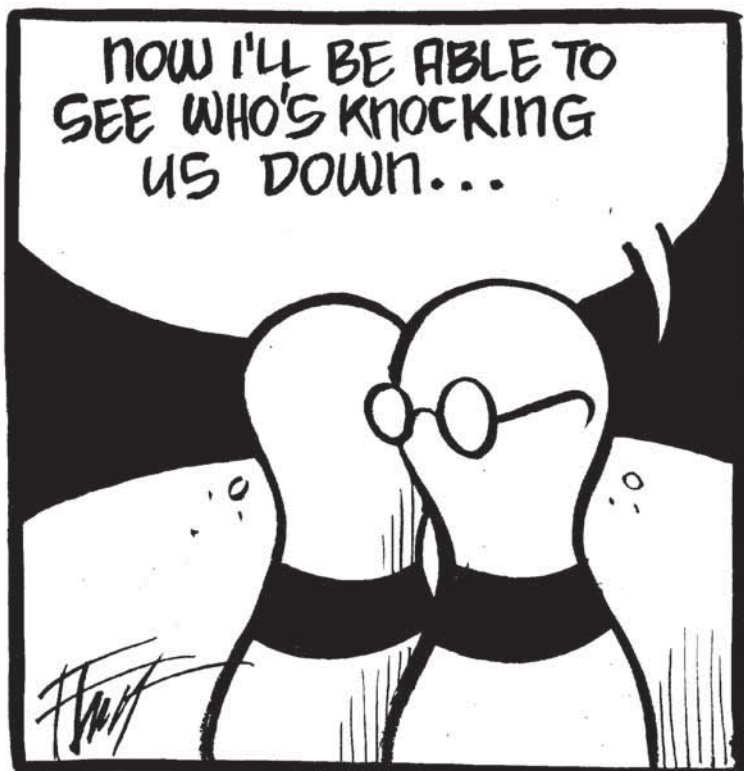

Additionally, the week included the 2021 edition of the PANAM Bowling Champion of Champions event, traditionally a standalone event that last was held in 2018. Due to the pandemic and uncertainty of the competitive schedule, it was held simultaneously with the PANAM Elite Championships and utilized some of the same

scores.

Two men and two women from each country were designated by the coaches to have their scores used toward the 2021 edition of the Champion of Champions.

The top four countries, based on the combined 24-game pinfall totals in each gender classification, plus the United States, qualified for the 2022 World Games. Because that event is being held in Birmingham, Alabama, the United States automatically gets spot as the host nation.

The Team USA representatives for the Champion of Champions event were Ander-

son, Russo, Bond and Coté.

The countries that qualified for the World Games from the men's field were Puerto Rico, Colombia, Costa Rica and Canada. For the women, Colombia, Mexico, Puerto Rico and Aruba advanced.

Competitors initially thought a spot in the World Games was all that was on the line for this year's Champion of Champions, but the top performers also were awarded gold medals based on their 24-game totals.

Russo claimed the prize on the men's side, marking his fifth Champion of Champions gold medal. He won four in four opportunities during his Team USA debut in 2018. He now has seven gold medals in 10 events.
