



Oklahoma City, Okla. (October 5 2020) – High School sophomore Eric Jones from Edmond, Okla., outperformed all the challengers to win the PBA Oklahoma City Southwest Open, Sunday. 



## 2021 USBC Championship Tournaments Schedule Announced

ARLINGTON, Texas - A new year is on the horizon, and that means exciting things for tournament bowlers and BowlTV subscribers.

The 2021 United States Bowling Congress event calendar again will include the traditional tournaments competitors of all ages and skill levels have grown to enjoy.

The tournament schedule and live BowlTV coverage will kick off with the USBC Team USA Trials during the first week of January.

The event originally was slated to take place in Las Vegas, but it now will be held in the Indianapolis area during the same time frame - Jan. 2-7. Complete details will be available next week.

The Team USA Trials will

be followed by two high-profile events run in conjunction with the Professional Bowlers Association - the 2021 U.S. Open and USBC Masters.

The U.S. Open tentatively is scheduled for Feb. 21-28 at The Ashwaubenon Bowling Alley in Green Bay, Wisconsin, and the Masters is slated for March 29-April 4 at the Gold Coast **Bowling Center in Las Vegas.** 

Both sets of dates are subject to change based on the schedule and programming for the PBA and its TV partner, FOX Sports, while locations and entry maximums also can change due to recommended best practices, social-distancing protocol and other COVID-19 restrictions.

We're excited to get back to doing what we love, and that

is putting on top-tier events for all of our USBC members, but we also know we must do so cautiously and responsibly, because the safety of the competitors is our top concern," **USBC** Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "The 2021 schedule has something for every segment of our bowlers, and we're really looking forward to sharing the year's most memorable moments with bowling fans around the globe through BowlTV."

Both the U.S. Open, a collaborative effort between USBC and the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America, and the Masters, again will be considered majors on the PBA Tour schedule. Qualifying and match play for both will be livestreamed on BowlTV, before



the action shifts to Fox Sports.

Invitations for the U.S. Open will be going out this week, and registration now is open for the pre-tournament qualifier, an on-site event that will give those who did not earn directentry into the tournament a chance to make the elite field. More information can be found at BOWL.com/USOpen.

The 2021 U.S. Open will feature 108 of the world's best bowlers, most of whom earned their spots in the event based on their recent on-lane performances. The list includes leaders on the PBA Tour points list and top performers at USBC events and PBA majors.

The U.S. Open format features qualifying across multiple oil patterns and round-robin match play, before the top five competitors advance to the TV stepladder, based on their 56-game pinfall totals.

The Masters generally attracts hundreds of the sport's top competitors for 15 games of qualifying over three days, before the field is cut to the top 63, plus the defending champion, for a unique doubleelimination match-play bracket that features three-game

The 2020 U.S. Open was held in Lincoln, Nebraska, in February and won by Australia's Jason Belmonte for the 12th of his record 13 major titles. The 2020 Masters was canceled in 2020 due to COVID-19. Left-hander Jakob Butturff won the event at Gold Coast in 2019.

Along with the U.S. Open and Masters, the format, location and entry maximums for all 2021 USBC tournaments are subject to change based on the recommended best practices and social-distancing protocols as the start date of each tournament approaches.

## **PWBA Tour Schedule Expands to 20 Events and** Introduces Classic Series, All Live on BowlTV

ARLINGTON, Texas - The 2021 Professional Women's **Bowling Association Tour** schedule will feature 20 tournaments, highlighted by the introduction of Classic Series events and an increase in the season's overall prize fund by nearly \$400,000.

The 2021 PWBA Tour schedule marks the first season since 2001 to include at least 20 events, with the first increase in the number of national tournaments being held since 2016. Each season from 2016 to 2019 featured 14 events, while the 2020 PWBA Tour season, which was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, also was scheduled to include 14 tournaments.

In addition to the growth on the national tour, the PWBA Regional program also will be expanding in 2021, with 14 events expected to be on the schedule.

The three Classic Series events on the 2021 PWBA schedule will be a combination of national and regional competition. The first will be the PWBA Kickoff Classic Series at the International Training and



Research Center in Arlington, Texas, from Jan. 18-26.

Classic Series events will feature three national tour events during one stop, in addition to a PWBA Regional tournament. The first two tournaments in each Classic Series event will be open to the entire field of entrants, while the third event will use the qualifying totals from the first two tournaments to determine which players will compete in the final tournament.

'We're incredibly excited to see the PWBA Tour schedule expand to 20 events in 2021,' **Bowling Proprietors' Asso**ciation of America Executive Director Frank DeSocio said. "We're thrilled to be able to

provide additional opportunities to showcase the top bowlers in the world next year."

In addition to the expanded schedule, the BPAA and United **States Bowling Congress will** continue to pay out a minimum of 32 spots at each standard PWBA Tour event. Each tournament will feature a \$60,000 prize fund, with \$10,000 going to the champion. The final cash spot will be \$1,100.

The organizations also will continue to add to the prestige and excitement of the two majors on the 2021 PWBA Tour schedule - the USBC Queens and U.S. Women's Open - by subsidizing the prize funds with an additional \$190,000 across the two events.

The collective efforts, plus the additional events in 2021, will help increase the overall prize fund for the season from approximately \$920,000 to more than \$1.3 million.

The 2021 broadcast schedule for the PWBA Tour will move exclusively to BowlTV.com and feature live coverage from qualifying through the stepladder finals of each event, including both major championships.







A staple of this column over the years has been not only televised bowling programming, but also about who watches. Some of the points I try to explain are the importance of how many watch, compared to other programming at the same time, that day, and that week.

The circle works like this. Network/broadcasters get to sell their commercial time based on how many and who watches. Getting viewers with the most disposable income, mainly viewers between 18 to 49 years of age, are just as important and at times more so than the total number of viewers.

There were a handful of certainties with television viewership. NFL games often pull in the largest average viewership numbers of the week, the Super Bowl draws over 100 million viewers, making Super Bowl Sunday a unofficial national holiday.

Nielsen ratings for the PBA in the 1960's surprised ABC-TV executives, thus became a staple on Saturday afternoons for decades, even airing finals on as many as three different sources in the early to mid-1980's in the same season (ABC, ESPN, NBC).

And then, life happed in the middle of March 2020. At the conclusion of the 2020 PBA World Championship on Fox, the daily, weekly, and monthly routines everyone followed disappeared, large public gatherings and live television sports included.

Live PBA programming, the last to go, was one of the first to return and ratings have been down slightly. But wait, average viewership for all live sports has been down across the board. The PBA on Fox draws better numbers than when FS1 airs shows, but all the replays on FS1 and FS2 boost those numbers. That pattern has remained true after mid-March.

What we've seen the main Fox network television ratings for the PBA are strong, yet the FS1 original offerings and subsequent replays show much less average viewership.

The Strike Derby averaged a solid 776,000 on a Saturday night in June, followed an 890,000 average viewership the week after for the Summer Clash. Subsequent FS1 telecasts didn't rank high enough to be listed, usually needing a minimum of 300,000 average viewers.

Jon Lewis, founder and editor of Sports Media Watch (sportsmediawatch.com), one of the sources I check for PBA Nielsen ratings, put together a chart he first posted October 15 on Twitter showing the drop in the various live sports programming (https:// twitter.com/paulsen\_smw/ status/1316911369162280961).

Decreases range between 13 to 61 percent, with the bulk in the 40% to 50% range. The only increases were WNBA, final round of the PGA Championship, and regular PGA Tour events on CBS. Even the World Series going on at Globe Life Field in Arlington now has lower average viewership. More on that later.

Further analysis can be found on prolific sports news website The Athletic (theathletic.com), posted October 23 by writer Richard Deitsch. He invited marketing executives from ESPN, Fox, and Sports **Business Journal and Sports Business Daily to comment on** what they are seeing pre and post pandemic.

Some adjustments were

in place, further detailing a point made in a prior JPA Troy Walker Media Column series, outlining the separation between watching sports on demand online versus live sports on broadcast outlets.

Among the rationale was many sports with shortened seasons completing out of season, available time to watch has been squeezed, and people are just tired of life since mid-March. Unique programming like NFL Draft on ABC and ESPN's "The Last Dance" had impressive viewership numbers.


The best thing is enough people are still finding time to watch the PBA.

It is a refreshing sign the NCAA women's bowling schools have started their season at the start of October, but last week there was one school you may have heard of who announced last week it was canceling its 2020-21 winter sports season.

Bethune-Cookman University President E. LaBrent Chrite announced last week with the current spike in COVID cases

## For League Bowlers, Detroit Is Still Number One

During my conversation with Aleta Sill last week, I commented to her that I had never really spent a lot of time in Detroit because of the tremendous good health of the bowling business in Michigan. One statistic that I often referenced during my time at AMF was that Detroit had twice as many league members as Chicago, which was the second largest city league membership in the USBC!

Sill confirmed my comment by stating, "Detroit once had more than 300 bowling centers in the metropolitan area, and now it's approaching only fifty centers." A look at the Metro Detroit USBC website authenticates Aleta's quote, with only three bowling centers remaining within the city limits of Detroit, and less than 60 in the entire suburban area.

Although the population

of Detroit has fallen to only 672,662 residents, the metropolitan area still remains strong with 4,292,060 individuals. Of the remaining bowling centers, there's a total of 1,962 lane beds, or one lane for every 2,187 people. While their numbers have diminished greatly, the population to lane ratio is probably still tops among all metropolitan markets, with only Las Vegas, now highly regarded as the "new" capital of bowling, approaching the numbers presented by Detroit.

A quick look at the Las Vegas market shows that there are 740 lanes in the greater metro area with a population of 2,227,053, or one lane for every 3,009 people. Both of the numbers for Detroit and Las Vegas are much more healthy in terms of lane beds than our previous investigation of Phoenix, Los Angeles and Northern

New Jersey.

Detroit has a total of ten bowling centers with more than 50 lanes, and another 12 between 40 to 48 lanes. Las Vegas weighs in with 9 large bowling centers of more than 50 lanes. My guess is that Detroit is much more dependent on league bowlers, while Las Vegas relies more on tournament and casual bowling from casino patrons.

Last time that we talked about this subject I shared an Area Survey Form that I used to determine the viability of building a bowling center in a particular market, much to the delight and interest of both the publishers and readers. The other form that was used in regards to a market potential for new construction or purchase of an existing location was a Competitive Pricing Survey.

Taking a look at the accompanying form, which was filled out roughly 35 years ago, provides an astonishing look at the increases in league and open bowling prices... and even shoe rental! As startling as those figures look, they represent "only" a 267% increase over the time frame mentioned. However, the bowling industry is not alone in this regard, as I often refer to similar increases in McDonald's prices as a comparison.

When I first visited a McDonald's (in Novato, Calif., circa the early 1970's), I can remember ordering two hamburgers (20 cents each), one order of french fries (25 cents), and a milkshake (30 cents)... all for less than \$1 dollar! Today the milkshake alone is more than \$5.00, and the total fee for the four items is roughly \$10.50, or over a 1,000% increase.

What will the future hold for bowling? It's a difficult question to answer, but one thing is for sure... bowling will continue. It's a remarkable game that is so easy that anyone can do it, and yet so difficult that no one can master it on a consistent basis. Not even Jason Belmonte.

want you to deny your experiences or try to be someone you are not when you're bowling. If you want to analyze, go for it. And then ACT ON YOUR ANALYSIS.

It's the second guessing and doubts and hesitation that kill your execution, not the analysis. Flow and repeatability are mindless. You know you can do it. You already have. It's not that you can't; you just aren't. Make your decision, believe in whatever you've decided, and go for it. Your body already knows how if you can just get your mind to shut up!



around its Daytona Beach, Florida campus, the university board of trustees decided to,

...forgo all spring athletic competition, including football, men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, and track and field. The recent spike in COVID-19 positivity rates in Florida and Volusia County, and on campus provides clear and unambiguous evidence, in our view, that now is simply

not the time to resume athletic competition.'

Also included are its NCAA women's bowling team.

What is unknown at press time was the employment fate of the school's coaching staff, including a friend of this column, Women's Bowling Head Coach Chelsea Gilliam. Those decisions are yet to be made.

She was one of the subjects of a piece I wrote about her and Daron Hansen fighting lifethreatening health conditions for the January 2018 Bowlers Journal International online

edition. Gilliam's story about her continuing fight against breast cancer, which she has had since an October 2015 diagnosis at the age of 25. Within a few months, the cancer spread to her left femur.

In a message, Gilliam (pictured here in a recent photo), said her form of cancer is now a HER2+, making it easier to treat. Only 15% of all cases change from HER2- to HER2+, thus necessitating a new treatment plan.

With four-person teams being used at USA Bowling events, the competition features a unique Baker format. For each Baker game, the first two bowlers in the lineup each bowl three frames (1-5-9 and 2-6-10, respectively), while the other two team members bowl two frames each (3-7 and 4-8).

Team rosters can feature up to six players, giving each coach the opportunity to bring in substitutes during competition.

**USA Bowling Regional** tournaments started in 2013, building the foundation that would lead to the inaugural USA Bowling National Championships in 2016. The national event grew from the USA Bowling program, designed as
