FORT WORTH, TX – In the 50-59 group of the Age Bracket tournament at Cityview Lanes in Fort Worth, Saturday, January 8, Tony Franklin led qualifying averaging 250 on

Saturday. He won 5 of his 8 matches to win his first SASBA title and collected \$1,100!

He threw the Storm Hustle Camo and Electrify Solid for the win!

In the 60-69 group, Joe Lecroy qualified 3rd then won 5 of his 8 matches on Sunday to claim the title and \$1,050.

Lecroy averaged 246 during the finals for the win. It was Joe's 33rd SASBA title.

In the 70 and over division, Randy Summers led the qualifying on Saturday by 61 pins.

He won 6 of his first 7

matches on Sunday morning and had a 91 pin lead over Rick Minier going into the final game.

Rick won the match 246-194, but Randy held on by 9 pins for the win and \$1,050.

This was Randy's 13th SASBA title.

Randy used the Storm Phase 3 and Dark Code and the 900 Global Zen for his win.

David Smith, Chris Hibbits and Bill Uthoff each had 300 games during qualifying. Thomas Young and Mike

With the first major title of the season and \$100,000 on the line, fans got to see rivals Jason Belmonte and top seed Sean Rash battle it out.

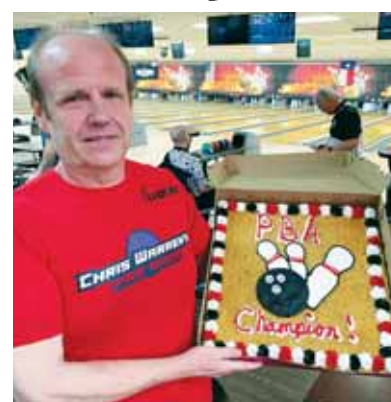
It wasn't the cleanest match with both players struggling on the left lane. Rash had two splits on the lane, Belmonte had one and just one strike heading into the 10th frame.

"It was far from easy," Belmonte said about the challenging dual-pattern conditions. "Sean or I didn't really love that left lane and I had to finish on it. I knew coming into the 10th just to give myself one shot."

Belmonte surprised many when he picked up his Storm Spectre before the final frame, looked toward his Storm ball

ALLEN, TX – Jon Delaney realized a lifelong dream two weeks ago in Odessa by winning the PBA SW Region Odessa Open, and he did it on his 60th birthday.

This was his first profes-

sional victory, and it comes with a once-in-a-lifetime story.

Diamond Lanes was also hosting a PBA50 Regional that weekend, that Jon was primarily there to bowl.

He left a 7-9 split in the 10th frame of the last game that caused him to miss the PBA50 cut by about 20 pins. For any of the PBA50 bowlers that didn't make the cut, they could then enter the regular PBA regional and try their luck with the kids later that afternoon.

Delaney was obviously frustrated with the finish and was ready to go home, but was talked into staying and competing by his son, Chris, who was bowling in the regular regional.

"He had a really good look in the senior event and yes, the pattern was going to be differ-

The PBA is off and running with their first tournament concluding here in DFW at Bowlero Euleess. Belmo defeats Sean Rash for his 14th major championship, he is second to none.

Bowling loves drama, much like all sports, and we had some surrounding the finals due to some hot sports opinions by Sean Rash. He was fined, put on probation, and made the center of attention for dropping an S-bomb on national TV in regards to perceived unfair-

ness in the fact that the PBA uses Brunswick machines, Brunswick oil, and the first two events were won by Brunswick staffers.

The conduct unbecoming part came up when he threw out the S-bomb prior to Matt Russo finishing his tenth frame, for what should have been three Brunswick staffers in a row winning. Russo, however, went out there and threw a bad shot, got five through the face, and Rash wins.

If you are wondering about what the future of Professional bowling will look like, specifically what the Men's professional tour will look like, let me give you a hint.

First, start by watching the PBA Junior National Championship that was held last weekend, also at Bowlero Euleess, and can be seen again on FloBowling.

The youth bowlers have unbelievable skills, like nothing we have seen before. And as far as how it will look, well, there won't be many people using their thumbs.

There were 10 finalists that competed on Friday, of those, there was only one bowler that used his thumb. One.

Eight right-handed, two-handers (no thumb), and one left-handed, two-hander (no thumb) that led qualifying by a bunch.

It's the state of the game and there is no turning back, and no doubt this is what it's going to take to compete at the highest levels.

I remember having a conversation about five years ago with USBC Exec Director, Chad

Murphy about the raw numbers of two-handers competing at Junior Gold. At that point it was around 20-25%, but when you factor in the best of the youth competitors, the number is higher, and if you use this tournament as a gauge, it was 90%...90%.

It's really amazing. I don't have a problem with it at all, but I sure am glad I won't have to compete much against these kids because they are all going to change the landscape of bowling, and it's right around the corner.

Sticking with the PBA theme this week, as I was researching the Looking Back column, I came across the Quaker State Open Results from 30 years ago. It was my first PBA national stop as I ventured out into the professional bowling world rooming with Del Ballard, David Smith, Robert Lawrence, and Bill Oakes.

It was always my dream to bowl professionally and while I only did it for about two years, I still look back on it fondly, one for the experiences, but mainly for the lifelong friendships it created.

I spent a lot of time with

the semis, and finished with a 292-pin lead over Chris Hibbitts after match-play.

Franklin earned \$1550 for the victory plus a free entry into the national USBC Sr. Master's event in Las Vegas in June.

Hibbitts took home \$1350 for second.

There were 93 entries this year, up about 20% from last year.

Jordan, Martin Win PBA Junior National Championship at Bowlero Euless

Zachary Smullen from Frisco finishes 9th

Euless, Texas - With some of the best professional bowlers in the world watching, 15-year-old Landin Jordan and 17-year-old Jillian Martin shined as they won the 2022 PBA Junior National Finals in their divisions.

Martin, of Ohio, has been on this stage before, winning the girls championship last year while also becoming the youngest ever to win a PWBA national title at the 2021 PWBA BowlTV Classic.

She faced one of her closest friends, 15-year-old Kayla Starr.

Starr worked her way up the stepladder averaging 245 over three games to get into the title match. Through five frames Starr held a 27-pin lead but then lost her look on the right lane.

Martin struck out in the 10th to force Starr to double and get one-pin for the win on the right lane. The Maryland resident left a pocket 7-10 to lose, 201-179.

"It feels amazing," Martin said, "especially going up there in the 10th frame knowing I

needed all three to put the pressure on Kayla to get a double. Just to be able to go up there and do it is a big confidence boost.”

The boys championship finals featured Jordan and fellow two-hander, 17-year-old Eric Jones. Jones won the 2020 PBA Oklahoma City Southwest Open to become the youngest ever to win a PBA regional.

They combined for 16 strikes in the match. After Jones missed the 2-4-7 in the 10th, Jordan stepped up needing

a mark to win. The Illinois native aced yet another shot to win, 257-225. Both Jordan and Martin earned \$16,000 SMART scholarship with their victories.

“It was a stunning moment,” the two-handed righty said after the win. “Anything is possible. I can compete against some of the greatest bowlers, and I can perform under the bright lights with immense pressure.”

With the win, Jordan got the chance to team up with one of his “top-5” favorite bowlers, EJ Tackett to face Jones and PBA Hall of Famer Tommy Jones in the PBA/PWBA Pro/Junior Doubles Competition. Martin

267-237.

"He is someone I've always looked up to, so it was cool bowling with him," Jordan said. Both Jordan and Martin also earned an additional \$1,000 scholarship from H5G Brands for winning their doubles event.

After the event was over, Martin, who graduated high school in December, raced out of Bowlero Euless to catch her flight to Indianapolis to bowl in the U.S. Open Pre-Tournament Qualifier. She finished in 23rd place earning a spot in the tournament. After the U.S. Open, she plans to bowl some PWBA Tour events and PBA Junior Regional Tournaments when they fit into her busy schedule. This fall, she will attend and bowl for the University of Nebraska.

Next up for Jordan is an elite youth tour event and an Illinois scholarship tournament. "Knowing that I can do it helps my confidence an extreme amount," he said.

This tournament showed this sport is in great hands. Fourteen-time major PBA champion Jason Belmonte first saw Martin compete in a Storm Youth Championship when she was just 13. He has been impressed watching her game evolve and seeing this next generation compete on PBA oil patterns and on national television.

"Jillian coming through the ranks and having these opportunities, it's going to be really exciting to see where her career goes," he said. "It is no wonder why when you do look around the U.S. at the youth in this country how talented and how great these kids are already. It's because they have had so much access to high-quality competition and big event venues."

He predicts Martin will become the best female bowler in the world. And seeing a high number of two-handed youths competing definitely caught his attention.

"Many people know my story and about the difficult times through my career because I bowled a little bit different," he said. "Like 30 percent of the junior players in the U.S. bowl two-handed. Just to know that I had that kind of an impact is pretty awesome."

Jon Delaney Wins PBA Odessa SW Winter Open, Chris Barnes Takes PBA50 Title

Odessa, Texas, (January 23, 2022) – Jon Delaney of McKinney, Texas, won his first PBA regional title on Sunday's PBA Odessa Southwest Winter Open at Diamond Lanes. The victory came on Delaney's 60th birthday.

Delaney was tied for the tournament lead going into the eight game round robin match play finals, fell back in the standings after the first five games, then finished with games of 239 and 258 in games six and seven before defeating defending champion Anthony Lavery-Spahr from Pasadena, Texas, 258-248, in the final game position round to claim the \$2,800 first place check.

Venezuelan Ildemaro Ruiz Jr rolled a 265 his last game to surpass Lavery-Spahr and grab second place, earning \$1,800, while Lavery-Spahr collected \$1,350 for third.

In the PBA50 competition, PBA Hall of Famer, Chris Barnes, now living in Denton, Texas, finished on top of a quality field of senior players.

In the 21-game event, Barnes grabbed the lead early in the qualifying and led most of the way, holding off a mild challenge from Tony Lanning, of Yukon, Okla., who finished second. The win was Barnes third in PBA50 Regional competition, and 33rd regional title overall.

The timeless concept of legacy explained in the final December 2021 JPA was shown this time on the January 2022 cover of Bowlers Journal International. Shown are eight children of some of the most familiar names from both pro tours in the last two generations.

There always have been kids of well-known bowlers who have pursued their parents' paths with varying degrees of success, but not quite on this

wide scale. With all the opportunities available to younger bowlers these days, it should not be too surprising. These kids are not just ok, they are really, really good. From Junior Gold to Team USA Trials to PBA Regionals to local scholarship events, they have shown they are not afraid to put in the work to make a name for themselves.

It starts by hanging out with mom and dad at tour events or at work with their respective

ball manufacturers, getting immersed in the tour culture and lifestyle. One thing I know for sure, ball company reps know talent when they see it. Watching how the ball comes off the hand, watching ball paths down the lane, then watching how pins fall and where the ball exits the pin deck are measured in almost a blink of an eye. Since they are used to seeing the best in the world, a common facial expression is a wry smile and a shake of the head in amazement. A phrase nowadays is saying the bowler looks like he or she is playing a video game.

I was no expert by any means as a high school senior the first time I saw a guy with a high backswing throw it like Mark Roth. There was the ball motion, the ball path, and then there was that sound of the ball hitting the pins, even surprising many of the older bowlers and junior coaches. I knew Pete Weber would be the future of the PBA. Ten months later, he made his first television finals.

Before you sigh, roll your eyes, and say, "Ok, Boomer," hear me out. Parents of these next stars were the big deal on both tours in the 1980's and 90's. They were undoubtedly influenced by the pros of the 1960's and 70's when career steps were measured by how many times Chris Schenkel, Billy Welu, and Bo Burton would say your name on Saturday afternoons on ABC-TV, or by Denny Schreiner and Leila Wagner on ESPN.

Having spoken to a handful of pros from those early days, they often compared it to being a rock star, instantly recognized in all sorts of social settings. The mall, grocery stores, restaurants, even at the DMV were places they were recognized, then asked for an autograph.

What Women Want

I must admit that I always enjoy the holidays and watching a fair amount of “chick flicks.” My favorite has to be Legally Blonde. Aside from Animal House, I have probably memorized more scenes in Legally Blonde than any other movie. There’s something about the Elle Woods character that’s really captivating to me, especially while sitting at home alone in what many would describe as a self-induced COVID-quarantine.

Another movie that really gets me thinking about “What Women Want”, starring Mel Gibson and Helen Hunt. It’s an interesting look through the eyes of Gibson, an ad executive that acquires the ability to hear what women are actually thinking. Having worked with and for a couple of powerful women in my life, I found this ability to comprehend a woman’s thoughts most intriguing.

What does any of this have to do with bowling, you might be asking? It all began when I was watching a double feature of Legally Blonde and Legally Blond 2 on MTV over the weekend. I couldn’t help but think about the recent announcement by Colie Edison, and her decision to leave both the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) and Bowlero Corporation. Her decision to leave must have been based upon a feeling of accomplishment in achieving her goals... or an even greater challenge awaiting her at the Women’s National Basketball Association (WNBA).

I remember the first time that I met Colie at the Grand Reopening of Bowlmor Greenbrook in suburban New Jersey,

in 2015. The affair brought back memories for me of the elaborate Grand Reopening of AMF East Meadow Bowl about 30 years earlier. The employees of Greenbrook, formerly known as AMF Strike & Spare Lanes, even wore tuxedos - an idea that we used to introduce the newly renovated East Meadow Bowl as “The Bowling Center of Tomorrow... Today!”

When I introduced myself to Tom Shannon, the president and chairman of Bowlmor AMF, I mentioned that I had one day held the position of vice president of marketing for AMF Bowling Centers. He turned to his left and said, “This is my vice president of marketing, Colie Edison.” With all that was going on that day, I could not believe the time that she spent with me, talking about the grand opening of East Meadow Bowl from 30 years earlier, and how it compared and contrasted with Greenbrook.

Colie is a Jersey Girl. Her father is actually from Edison, but she doesn’t think that her family is related to the city’s most famous resident, Thomas Alva Edison, inventor of the light bulb, the phonograph and the motion picture camera. After graduating from Tulane University in New Orleans in 2006, where she majored in marketing, Colie began her career with Estee Lauder in New York City.

Ms. Edison was with Estee Lauder for less than one year when she applied for and received a position with Bowlmor in New York City as director of brand strategy from 2008 to 2012. Her LinkedIn page then lists Walton Isaacson in Culver

City, Calif., as her next occupation from 2012 to 2013. After that brief interlude she returned to Bowlmor AMF, where she became vice president of marketing from 2013 to 2017, before accepting the position of chief customer officer for Bowlero Corporation from 2017 to 2022.

For those of you that are not from the bowling industry it should be noted that Bowlmor, Bowlmor AMF and Bowlero Corporation are all names for the same company, as it grew to become arguably the most powerful organization in the world of bowling. Proof of that dominance was illustrated when the group purchased the PBA in 2019, and installed Ms. Edison as the first female CEO of any men’s professional sport, a position that she has held until her recent announcement.

I wish for the purposes of this article that I had Mel Gibson’s power to read women’s minds, as portrayed in What Women Want. But then again, maybe it’s best to let sleeping dogs lie, and be thankful for the time that the venerable game of bowling enjoyed the remarkable marketing achievements of Colie Edison.

Reracking spares

This is like fingernails on a blackboard. It discounts spares and sends the message they are not worthy of attention. That's just not so.

If you are working on keeping your balance or making sure you follow through or hitting your target or whatever, then work on those things. You don't only keep your balance or follow through or hit your

target on strike shots. Every time you rerack a spare, you are telling yourself they don't count, aren't as important as strike shots, and you can always make up for a missed one anyhow.

If you've ever been to a pro tournament, you might have seen the pros reracking spares. They already know what to do to make spares on whatever condition is out there. They

won't miss a spare because they don't know how to make it.

They call a missed spare a "hole." Any hole in their score is unacceptable. It is certainly true there are those people who think they can strike enough to make up for a missed spare, but they don't last long on Tour. In fact, they used to get the dubious honor of being on Coach John Jowdy's All MISS team - Miserable In Spare Situations.

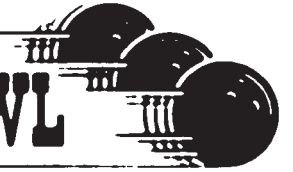
Either shoot every spare shot, working on whatever you are working on, or practice hitting your strike line, but don't rerack a spare. The psychological message is a strong one and will really cost you later.

reps for affirmation, got the nod of approval to switch balls and he just let it fly.

He felt he was going "into the unknown" a little bit but he hit his target and "made the best shot I possibly could." He struck, threw his Storm Belmo Gold ball straight down the middle to get nine and converted the spare. That was the knockout punch he needed to defeat Rash, 210-202.

The two-handed Aussie raised his arms straight up, pounded his chest and emphatically yelled, 'I'm back.' He also

pointed toward Storm CEO Bill Chrisman and said, 'thank you.' This year marks 20 years since Belmonte first signed a contract with Storm.

Belmonte is now a three-time winner of the PBA Players Championship, and he has 26 career PBA Tour titles to add to his impressive legacy. Next up, he will seek to earn yet another major at a difficult event.

Tammy Turner Elected to USBC Hall of Fame for 2022

ARLINGTON, Texas - Tammy Turner of West Palm Beach, Florida, has been elected to the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame and is the final addition to a four-person 2022 induction class.

She will join Bo Goergen of Midland, Michigan (Outstanding USBC Performance), Bill Allen of Orlando, Florida (Veterans), and Roger Zeller of San Antonio (Meritorious Service), who were elected by the USBC Hall of Fame Committee in October.

The induction ceremony will take place April 27 during the 2022 USBC Convention in Las Vegas.

Allen and Zeller both will be inducted posthumously, as they died in 1992 and 1997, respectively.

Turner was the only woman on this year's Superior Performance ballot, which also featured five men. The category is voted on by a panel of USBC Hall of Fame members, veteran bowling writers and members of the USBC Board of Directors, and a minimum of 70% of the votes is required for election.

The men's ballot included Dave Ferraro of Kingston, New York; Bryan Goebel of Shawnee, Kansas; Wes Malott of Fort Wayne, Indiana; Randy Pedersen of Orlando, Florida; and Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas. None of the men were elected for 2022.

Turner, a 51-year-old righthander, excelled collegiately with West Texas A&M, internationally with Team USA and then on the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour during the 1990s, before back surgery late in the decade derailed her professional career.

She was the 1994 PWBA Rookie of the Year and went

on to earn four PWBA Tour titles in her first three seasons, including a pair of victories in 1996.

Though she left the tour for good in 2002, she remained in the national spotlight as a regular participant at the USBC Women's Championships, where she collected more than a dozen top-10 finishes and two Classic Team titles through 2013.

With the PWBA Tour on hiatus from 2003-2014, competitive opportunities for women were limited, but Turner capitalized on one in 2009, when she burst back onto the sport's top tier with a win at the 2009 U.S. Women's Open for her first major title. She was the runner-up at the U.S. Women's Open in 1998 and finished second at the USBC Queens in 1996.

Along with the 2022 inductees, the six members of the 2020 class and four members of the 2021 USBC Hall of Fame class also are awaiting their inductions.

Champions Determined at 2022 USBC Team USA Trials and U.S. Amateur Championships in Vegas

LAS VEGAS - Following a lengthy hiatus due to COVID-19, international bowling competition recently resumed, and the Team USA program returned to action for a handful of successful events on two continents.

For some players, the excitement and momentum from those trips carried over to the 2022 United States Bowling Congress Team USA Trials, where they battled over five

days to retain their spots on the Team USA roster.

Others arrived at the Gold Coast Bowling Center this week looking for the opportunity to make the team in the new year and help be a part of the squad's success in 2022.

The top overall performers across 30 games and five challenging oil patterns were Shannon Pluhowsky of Dayton, Ohio, and Darren Tang of

Las Vegas. They bested their respective fields of 125 women and 161 men.

Two other competitors - Chloe Skurzynski of Carlisle, Pennsylvania, and Trent Mitchell of Chicago - also claimed titles Friday as the nation's best non-professionals.

Skurzynski and Mitchell each survived a stepladder final that included the top three players from their divisions.

All four champions were among the 10 competitors who earned automatic berths on Team USA for 2022 based on their success this week in Las Vegas.

Pluhowsky was followed in the overall standings by Julia Bond of Aurora, Illinois (57), Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois (61), and reigning Professional Women's Bowling Association Player of the Year Bryanna Cot, of Tucson, Arizona (77). All three earned automatic spots on the team.

Tang is returning to Team USA for the first time since 2019, but he's a much different competitor than he was when he finished fifth at the 2019 Team USA Trials and then 12th in 2020 to miss making the team again.

The men's title ultimately came down to who made the bigger move in the final game, and Tang nearly was flawless in the effort. He fired a 279 game to surge from 24th place to 11th in the Day 5 standings. Troup closed with 224 and remained 12th on the day to finish as the runner-up.

Two other bowlers - Nick Pate of Inver Grove Heights, Minnesota (94), and AJ Johnson of Oswego, Illinois (108) - were able to retain their spots on the team by also finishing in the top four this week.

To claim the men's U.S. Amateur title, Mitchell rolled a clean game and tossed a clutch 10th-frame strike on the lane that had been giving him trouble throughout the match. He topped Nathan Stubler of LaSalle-Peru, Illinois, 218-199.

Skurzynski, a 21-year-old right-hander, also found herself in a tight title match that came down to the final frame. She defeated Danielle Jedlicki of Murfreesboro, Tennessee, 184-179.

To be eligible for the U.S. Amateur, a bowler must not hold or have held a professional membership (PBA or PWBA) in 2021. Also, anyone who has won a professional title (regional, national or senior) as a professional was not eligible to compete as an amateur.

In addition to those who automatically qualified for this year's adult team, two men and two women were selected by the National Selection Committee based on their performances this week.

Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Arizona, and Jake Peters of Henderson, Nevada, will join the men's team, and Lauren Pate of Manchester, Missouri,

and Breanna Clemmer of Clover, South Carolina, were added to the women's roster.

The National Selection Committee also selected five men and five women to join Team USA 2022, based on submitted resumes.

Marshall Kent of Las Vegas; Kristopher Prather of Romeoville, Illinois; Matthew Russo of Ballwin, Missouri; EJ Tackett of Bluffton, Indiana; and Chris Via of Blacklick, Ohio, were selected by the National Selection Committee to join the men's team.

Additions to the women's team were Stefanie Johnson of McKinney, Texas; Danielle McEwan of Story Point, New York; Missy Parkin of Laguna Hills, California; Jordan Richard of Maumee, Ohio; and Stephanie Zavala of Downey, California.

Bowlers now must be at least 18 years old as of the end of the Team USA Trials to be eligible for the adult version of Team USA.

Age-eligible participants competing this week also were vying for spots on Junior Team USA 2022.

"Butch has always given me great advice. If I was practicing, he would ask me what I was working on, and I used to say, nothing much, just practicing. He would then say that a missile with no direction, is just another bomb, he gave me direction," he added.

Like most, bowling has

always been a lifelong love for Jon and a dream to compete at the highest level. When he retired from his job of 33 years, he still felt that he should keep working, but it was his wife, Patty who pushed him to really go for it and treat bowling like a job.

"The first words out of my mouth when I got home, was to her, we did it, and that's the way I truly feel," said Delaney.

Jon stood up against the best pro bowlers that the SW has to offer and he came out on top. He did it on his 60th birthday and he truly earned it. It sounds like a movie script with the perfect ending, but for the Delaney family, it was real life that they will remember forever.

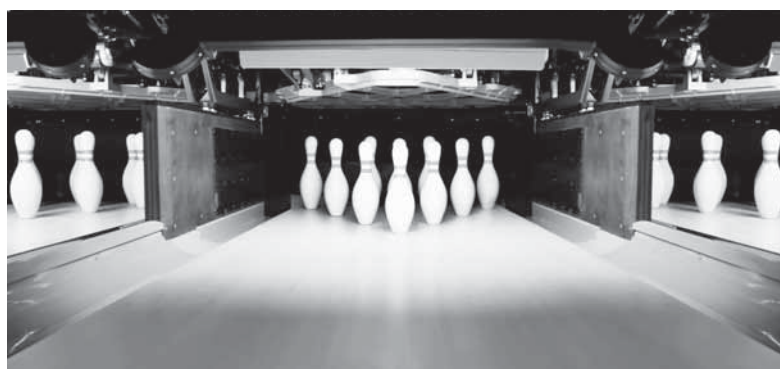
