Cindy Mann and David Smith Win Texas Senior Queens and Senior Masters

- Cindy Mann, bowling in her first ever Senior Queens tournament Saturday, January 28 at Time to Spare in Cut and Shoot, crushed the competition with a 304 pin victory over Debby Carter.

Mann averaged over 235 in the eight games of Match-Play.

Mann earned \$650 for the win with Carter taking home \$500 for second place.

There were 37 entries this year.

Other Finalists: 3rd Michelle Stephens \$450 4th Lisa Wasson \$400 5th Christy Antle \$350 6th Pam Lawrence \$325 7th Lisa Tipton-Gass \$275 8th Barbara Bias \$250 On the Men's side, David Smith was the champion in another dominating fashion, taking over the lead in the third game and never relinquishing. He won by 169 pins over runner-up Robert Reck, Sr.

Smith earned \$1650 for the victory plus a free entry into the national USBC Sr Master's event in Las Vegas in June.

Reck Sr. took home \$425 for second.

There were 81 entries this year.

ALLEN, Texas – Although Saturday's Professional Women's Bowling Association Greater Dallas Regional saw plenty of strikes during qualifying at JB's Allen Bowl, the title came down to a spare conversion as Ashley Rucker of Bartlesville, Oklahoma, filled her final frame to collect her first regional win.

Rucker, a 30-year-old lefthander, covered her third 7 pin of the title match and toppled

EJ Tackett Wins 2023 U.S. Open Title to Complete Triple Crown

INDIANAPOLIS, IN – E.J. Tackett of Bluffton, Indiana, described his second-place finish at the 2022 U.S. Open as a fairytale that ended too quickly.

On Sunday, Tackett authored the storybook ending he was longing for by defeating Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, North Carolina, 221-208 to win the 2023 U.S. Open presented by Go Bowling!

The victory gave Tackett his first U.S. Open title and third major overall, earning him the career triple crown.

Tackett won the 2016 Profes-

sional Bowlers Association World Championship in Reno and the 2017 FireLake Tournament of Champions in Owasso, Oklahoma.

Now that he's added the green jacket to his trophy case, Tackett just needs a United States Bowling Congress Masters title to achieve the grand slam.

However, that was the furthest thing from his mind after Sunday's hard-fought victory; instead, he was just trying to wrap his mind around how much this U.S. Open title

Congratulations go out to Cindy Mann and David Smith for winning the Texas Senior Queens and Masters last weekend at Time to Spare in Cut and Shoot, Texas.

Yes. Cut and Shoot is a real place, just north of Houston with a population of 1,087 as of the last census, but they have a 36-lane bowling center and were great hosts.

The story of the weekend was the margin of victories for both new champions, Mann by 304 pins over Debby Carter and Smith won by 169 over Robert

This year, the Texas State USBC decided to go with an easier oil pattern which led to some increased scores, but not nearly as high as some thought they would be. The overall carry and topography of the center kept the scores at a very manageable level.

For the men, it took an average of 214.8 to make the semi-finals, and 218.8 to make the top eight finals. For the ladies, it took an average of 188.8 to make the semi-finals and 198.4 to make the top eight finals. Nothing wrong with

those scores, not super high, but competitive all the way around.

Smith took over the lead in game three of the finals and never let go, "I threw the Infinite Physix as hard and straight as I could. Definitely not my A game but the slow wheel just never looked good for me," he said.

Cindy had an even larger margin of victory, but it wasn't without some drama along the way. "In the 5th game of match-play, my thumb insert broke and I didn't have a spare thumb due to some recent pitch changes. Luckily, Butch Warren was there to help, and he went back and forth with the Pro Shop to get it fixed and I was able to keep the lead," said Mann.

On Saturday, she threw the Zen Soul and Exotic Gem with success, but the move to the Proton Physix on Sunday was the key to the 300+ pin



eight games of qualifying on Saturday's 43-foot lane pattern, left her second consecutive 4 pin but was unable to convert the spare. She followed with a 2-10 split in the eighth frame and another open, giving Rucker the chance to open up her lead.

Rucker stayed clean in the eighth and ninth, but since she was unable to strike in either frame, Bella still had a chance to make things interesting with a strong finish.

Bella showed her resiliency by striking on her final four deliveries to force Rucker to mark in the 10th frame.

The former collegiate standout at Arkansas State hit the pocket on her first shot to leave her third consecutive 7 pin on the right lane, but she made quick work of the spare to put her on track for the win.

Rucker admitted if she was going to have to make any spare in that situation, she didn't mind seeing such a familiar foe. In addition to her three conversions in the title match, she also made three 7 pins in her semifinal win against 2021 PWBA Arlington Regional champion Jacqueline **Evans of Acton, Massachusetts**

"I like shooting my 7 pins, because I leave a lot of them," said Rucker, a former member of Junior Team USA. "I would have liked to strike, but if not, I wanted to leave something I could make. I was relieved it was a 7 pin and not a split or anything. I know I leave a lot of them, but I was glad to see that one.

Her semifinal match against Evans helped her settle into the final pair, but Rucker already felt comfortable stepping into JB's Allen Bowl after a successful debut at the 24-lane center during another competition.

That comfort, along with strong execution throughout the day, all played a part in Rucker's breakthrough win.

'I bowled here one other time for a SASBA event, and I was averaging 260 going into the last game," Rucker said. "I knew I really matched up well, at least with the house shot, so I was excited that this event was being held here. Overall, I was very happy with my execution for today, and I am super excited. It means a lot to finally get a win, because I've come close a few times. I'm very glad to get this first win.

Rucker averaged 229 during Saturday's eight-game qualifying round to determine the top four for the stepladder finals, earning the second seed.







She was leading the sold-out field of 60 athletes heading into the final game of qualifying, but Bella raced up the leaderboard to go from fifth to first after firing 279 in Game 8.

Bella earned the top seed with a 1,849 total (231.13 average), while Rucker finished with 1,832. Oklahoma City's Jasmine Ware qualified third with 1,812, and Evans was the final advancer in fourth with 1.809.

In addition to her strong showing at the Greater Dallas Regional, Bella earned time in the national spotlight after winning the Celebrity Super Clash at the Jimmie Allen PBA Challenge on FOX and competing at the PWBA Dallas Classic Series in 2022.

In the opening round of Saturday's stepladder, Evans delivered strikes on six of her first eight attempts to build an advantage over Ware on the way to a 237-206 victory.

Ware stayed clean to remain in the match until the final frame, but she was only able to roll one double during the game.

The next PWBA Regional event will be March 25 at the PWBA Greater Detroit Regional. The tournament will be held at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Michigan, just before the start of the United States **Bowling Congress Masters.**

The regional schedule features nine events across the United States in 2023 leading up to the Regional Showdown.

The field at the Regional Showdown will feature 16 players. Each regional champion in 2023 will automatically be seeded into match play at the

event, while the rest of the field will be determined through an eight-game qualifying round that will be open to all PWBA Regional-eligible bowlers.



The 2023 PBA season kicks off this month with a long-discussed concept for the shows airing on Fox Television and Fox Sports 1 (FS1). The latter match-play portions will also air, bring something the PGA Tour has had for years, multi-day television coverage. I'll have a review in the March

In the continuing series of Norm's Nuggets, excerpts from a recent interview with Norm Duke, he discusses one of his best-known major tourney wins, the 2011 U.S. Open, more known for how it ended. After Duke closed with a four-bagger (ok, Hambone), Mika Koivuniemi needed an 18-pin fill in the tenth frame to wrap up his second U.S. Open. He had won the Tournament of Champions and its \$250,000 first place check only five weeks before.

Mika left a solid 10-pin to start his tenth frame and to the surprise of the everyone, he missed it, giving Duke the strangest crowd reaction after winning a major title.

"I thought I'd been punked, I thought he's going get it (the spare attempt) over. Immediately when I saw him miss, I thought, 'They're punking me now, he'll get that over.' Then I saw him laying down on the ground, then it came to me.

Then I saw the realization on his family's faces. It was actually so real to me I felt worse for them than I did good for me. I felt terrible for that family (his wife and two daughters).

I hurt watching that family endure that pain. There were tears, they were sitting right next to me. It hit home. This is real for both of us. Mika's never going to miss a 10-pin, especially not when he needs it, ever. So that's why I thought I got punked," Duke said.

That miss may have been the only bad shot of Koivuniemi's second PBA Player of the Year season. In the March JPA. Duke talks about his most painful tournament loss and the PBA TV record he has had

######

As one of the first PBA stops of the season from 1974 to 1984 and 1988, Mel's Southshore Bowl in Alameda, California was the setting for some noteworthy events in the PBA television history. The 1974 finals featured Jim Stefanich's TV 300 game. The following year, the show opened on a bittersweet note with Chris Schenkel paying tribute to his color analyst Houstonian Billy Welu, who passed away the previous spring.

In the first match, Bill Spigner opened with the front nine strikes in his very first TV match while the 1980 telecast had Mark Roth's historic 7-10 split conversion.

The 1983 PBA AC-Delco Classic finals featured two players making their television debuts, one a familiar name in this publication over the years, Big Spring native Phil Ringener. The championship match featured top seed Toby

Contreras, the other first time TV finals player, against third seed Charlie Tapp, both looking for their first national tour win. I'll let you watch for yourself, but what was unique about this telecast was we got to see genuine reactions from the players and fans as the action played out in the title match, the selection and timing of the images added an exclamation point to the telecast.

For this month's JPA Lost Classic, we head back to January 22, 1983, the first and only national tour win of current **PBA Midwest Region manager** Toby Contreras. Here's the link: (https://www.youtube.com/ watch?v= vbeZekif060)

Tapp would snap off his first of three career PBA tour wins five months later in Seattle against Wayne Webb, qualifying him for the 1984 **PBA Firestone Tournament of** Champions.

A certain charming and delightful college TV reporter would interview Tapp about that '84 ToC trip after returning home to Minnesota the following week.

Little did I know that interview would be the start of covering bowling in some way, shape, and form since then. **Just Paying Attention started** 25 years ago this month in the Will County Sportsman, a local bowling newspaper published by the local radio legend Don Ladas in Joliet, Illinois.

Having worked a few local cable TV bowling shows with him, he was surprised with some of the pieces of information I came up with and thought those would work well in a column. But I was a broadcaster, not a print writer,

but after a year or so relented and began writing JPA. Here are a few highlights.

Those first couple of years of columns have been lost, but the third one I do remember well. I sent a copy to Bill Vint, then the ABC media director for a critique. Six months later, he sent back a response that I didn't expect. The first version of the Top 25 TV Bowling Moments list would make its way to an ABC monthly magazine, "Bowling." Later, Bob Johnson included it in the 100th Anniversary issue of Bowlers Journal International in 2013. I always thanked Bill and Bob for their generosity, still not quite believing this broadcast guy was on to something as a writer.

In one of the first JPA interviews, Joliet native Jim Stefanich added stunning details about his TV 300, especially the one about having so much skin oil from shaking so many hands following the game, the ball felt slippery, causing him to leave and miss two 10-pin spares in the following match, becoming one of a few to shoot an 800 series on national television and not win the tournament.

Much of the 1998 material was devoted to the inaugural year of the PBA on CBS-TV as The Association's broadcast network home after the prior 35 years on ABC-TV. It was a

change as the look of the telecast featured different camera angles and graphics.

Other columns included Tracy Weber taking us through the personality known as PDW as husband Pete became the ratings booster on ESPN in the early 2000s. Rick Benoit detailed how he assisted brother Bob change his game by watching ball reaction at the back end rather than at the arrows, paying off as Bob tossed best first game ever on national television ever with his 1988 TV 300 at Forum Bowl. This was a lynch pin of an industry-wide player shift in lane play strategy, describing ball reaction as tighter angles or bigger angles.

Mike Flanagan's viral video of Troy Walker's strike ball hitting the sweep at the 2013 Luci Doubles started a more serious analysis of how bowling and media mix in the annual columns known as the Troy Walker Media Analy-

One piece that created a buzz on social media was discovering Houston was being proposed as a USBC Open Championships host city. Knowing what buildings at the time had the size and time frame, I knew only one building at the time had the size to host it, the modern Eighth Wonder of the World, the iconic Astrodome.

Here's An Interesting Statistic...Winning The U.S. Open - By One Pin!

While searching twitter.com and Elon Musk's entries for the latest installment of "Twitter Files," I couldn't find any new entries from the likes of Matt Taibbi, Bari Weiss, Alex Berenson and others, so I decided to search for my other favorite topic - bowling news, within the content provided by members of the Twitter

Typing in 'bowling news' brought me to an interesting page known as "The Bowling News Network," presented by bowlingballgalaxy. com. The very first tweet captured my attention with the following title: Five Times the U.S. Open Was Won By One Pin. This should be interesting, I thought to myself, as I couldn't

even think of one title match that was decided by one pin.

Surprisingly, all five of the title matches decided by just one pin at the U.S. Open have been contested since the year 2000! (So much for my photographic memory). And here I was, all set to journey back in time to the days of the BPAA All Star Tournament (forerunner to the U.S. Open), to look at all those historical

The first of the historic one pin matches was won by Robert Smith of Simi Valley, Calif., over Norm Duke, originally from Ft. Worth, Texas, but now living in Clermont, Florida. Suddenly my memory came back to me as I remembered Smith striking out in the tenth frame for a final score of 202, forcing Duke to get the first strike in the tenth. Duke left an 8 pin, spared and struck on the fill ball for a 201.

This would be the first of 7 PBA titles for Smith in a nine-year span (2000-2008), in addition to one international title in the Philippines in 2010. While living in many different parts of the world, including Hawaii and Hong Kong, the 49-year-old now resides in Oxnard, Calif., according to the official PBA website.

Not enough can be said about Norm Duke, who is without question one of the top ten bowlers of all time, as we have documented many times. With 40 national PBA titles, and one of only three bowlers to complete the Grand Slam of bowling (USBC Masters, PBA Tournament of Champions, U.S. Open and PBA World Championships), he remains a fan favorite wherever he goes with the familiar chant, 'Duke, Duke, Duke.' (The others to complete the Grand Slam of bowling are Mike Aulby and Jason Belmonte).

The next one pin title match at the U.S. Open came at the 2005 event, when Chris Barnes of Denton, Texas, narrowly missed leaving the 4-10 split in the tenth frame, when the 10-pin toppled at the last second. Barnes converted the 4 pin and struck on the fill ball for a . 213-212 victory over Patrick Allen of Elmwood Park, New Jersey. Allen now runs the pro shop at the beautiful Parkway Lanes that's located in Elmwood Park, while Barnes still competes regularly on both the national and senior PBA circuits.

Single pin title match number three came in 2012. How could I ever forget this one? I certainly did not forget Pete Weber's famous announcement when he defeated Michael Fagan of Westbury, N.Y., by a score of 215-214: "Who do you think you are? I am!" Fagan put a halt to his pro bowling career in 2017. He is now the Director of Business Development for a company that owns bowling centers in Minnesota.

Weber, a St. Louis native that we have reported on many times, is in the same rarified air as Norm Duke, with a career that has only been topped by the immortal Walter Ray Williams Jr., in titles and money earnings. He has made the U.S Open and their storied difficult lane condition his personal priority, with a record five victories. His famous father, Dick Weber, and the legend-ary Don Carter are tied for second, each with four victories when the tournament was known as the BPAA All Star.

Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Arizona, has played a part in the last two one-pin matches, with defeats at the hands of Dom Barrett of Cambridge, England (207-206, at Wichita, Kansas, in 2018), and then to Chris Via of Springfield, Ohio (214-213, at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada, in 2021). In addition to his seven PBA tournament victories, Jakob also has three Gold Medals in Team USA competition.

I can't help but wonder what young viewers of YouTube in 25 years will think when they see all of the competitors at the 2021 U.S. Open wearing surgical masks. There doesn't appear to be any significance to wearing the masks, except that they all contain a major sponsor name or logo. There's also no mention by the announcers about the masks during the broadcast, as we had all become 'comfortably numb' about the process of wearing masks by that time.

Speaking of Pink Floyd, has anyone else noticed the bizarre correlation between the COVID-19 confusion and many of the lyrics in "Comfortably Numb?" Here are just

a few:
I hear you're feeling down
Well I can ease your pain
I'll need some information first
Just the basic facts
Can you show me where it hurts?

Okay, okay, okay Just a little pinprick There'll be no more But you may feel a little sick You have become comfortably numb

It would appear that Pink Floyd was not only psychedelic, but also psychic.

Knowing Without Seeing

You can never ignore what the heads are doing. When targeting far down the lane, for instance, you must know what is happening to your ball in the heads even if you don't see it. How? By knowing the angle the ball crossed your target.

You must have a plan of what direction you want the ball to be going when it hits your target. Maybe for you it

does that is essential to the success of the shot.

Don't think you must see your ball go through the heads. That isn't necessary. You'll know what it does in the heads without really seeing it. AND you don't have to a psychic. Just OBSERVE as the ball passes through the target.

Let's say your target is the 10th board at the arrows and your intention is to play down the boards. This would mean that you want to lay the ball down on the 10th board, be on 10 at the arrows, and go no farther outside than 10 at any point on the lane.

If your ball crosses the 2nd arrow going left-to-right, it will have to go farther right than the 10th board at some point on the lane. Therefore, you haven't hit 10 the way you intended. You were INSIDE of target in the heads, not getting to the target the way you intended. If the ball should cross 10 from right-to-left, you were OUTSIDE of where you intended to be through the heads.

After all, you can't send the ball left-to-right or right-to-left through the heads and when the ball gets to the 2nd arrow, it all of a sudden straightens out and starts going down the boards!

So, you see it isn't THAT you hit your target; it's HOW you

meant to him.

"There's a whole mountain of things that this win means, the U.S. Open, the triple crown, winning at Woodland and getting my banner hung up with all of the others who have won here, winning in the state of Indiana, the list just goes on and on," Tackett said. "This is absolutely incredible; it almost has me at a loss for words."

What was equally incredible was the dramatic fashion in which it happened.

That's because after six days, 48 games and nine frames, this year's U.S. Open title was determined by a single shot.

The championship match was tied at 164 through eight frames, which meant that both Tackett and Troup had the opportunity to strike out to finish at 224

Troup struck in the ninth and on the first ball in the tenth, but his second shot in the final frame left the Big 4 (4-6-7-10 split).

He was unable to convert, taking two pins to finish with a final score of 208.

Nevertheless, Troup's first strike was crucial as it meant that Tackett would have to match with a strike of his own to start the tenth. If he failed to do so, he would be the U.S. Open runner up for the second consecutive year.

With everything on the line, Tackett stepped up and delivered a flush shot into the 1-3 pocket.

For a fraction of a second, it looked like the 10 pin was going to stand, but it slowly toppled over to keep Tackett's title bid alive.

Now, he needed at least seven pins on his next two balls in order to win the crown.

Leaving nothing to chance, Tackett delivered another flush strike, this one a no-doubter that officially sealed the win, giving Tackett the trophy, the green jacket and the \$100,000 first-place prize.

"I never looked at the scoreboard, so I didn't know exactly what I needed. I just knew that if I stepped up there and threw a really good shot like I had been, the tournament would be mine," Tackett said. "I really thought I had rung the ten on that first shot, but it fell over, and now here I am talking to you."

Tackett was understandably overcome with emotion at various times throughout that talk as the realization that he had accomplished a goal that he's dreamt about for nearly 20 years slowly began washing over him.

"You know, I remember being on the lanes practicing when I was 12 and pretending that I needed a double in the tenth frame to beat Norm Duke for the U.S. Open title," Tackett said. "This morning, Norm texted me and said 'post your shot, post your score; everything else is just fish stories. I love you; go get 'em.' That meant a lot to me.

"I know that there are so many people who live and die on every shot I make. I'm not bowling for just me because so many people want me to be successful and have given up so much to allow me to be here. I'm living in a fairytale."

Troup nearly completed his own fairytale U.S. Open ending, winning Saturday's stepladder battle between seeds No. 5-9 on FS1 and emerging victorious in Sunday's first three matches on FOX before eventually falling to Tackett in the title bout.

Troup began his day with a 207-192 victory over England's Richie Teece, this year's No. 4

That match was close throughout, but an untimely washout (1-2-4-10) in the eighth by Teece allowed Troup to open Sunday's telecast with a 207-192 victory.

Defending champion Anthony Simonsen of Las Vegas was Troup's Match 2 opponent.

Simonsen was looking to become the youngest player in PBA history to win five major titles and the first player to successfully complete a U.S. Open title defense since Dave Husted accomplished the feat in 1996, one year before Simonsen was born.

Troup held a 21 pin lead through eight frames and appeared to be on his way to victory, but things turned dramatic when he left a 1-2-4-10 washout in the tenth frame.

Troup threw a quality shot at the conversion, but the head pin went around the 10 pin, forcing Troup to settle for 203 and giving Simonsen the opportunity to strike out to beat him by a pin.

It wasn't meant to be for the defending champion, however, as his first ball in the tenth went high and left the 3-4-6-7 split, which gave Troup a 203-177 victory and ended Simonsen's valiant bid for a U.S. Open repeat.

With Simonsen van-

teams received a bye in the first round. In the women's division. the top five teams received a bye from opening-round competition.

In the men's division, Iowa **Central Community College** set the pace during qualifying to earn the top seed for the bracket, finishing with a 7,835 total. Baker was second with 7,732, Ottawa-Kansas was third with 7,710 and Kansas Wesleyan earned the final first-round bye with 7,548.

As the bracket continued to narrow the field, No. 5 Culver-Stockton and No. 6 Peru State

USBC Hall of Famer Jeanette Robinson Dies at age 94

ARLINGTON, Texas – United States Bowling Congress and Professional Women's Bowling Association Hall of Famer Jeanette Robinson died Jan. 31 at the age of 94.

Robinson was elected to the PWBA Hall of Fame in 1996 in the Pioneer category, and she was inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame in 2000 for Meritorious Service.

Born in Flint, Michigan, Robinson developed and shared her passion for the sport as a competitor, instructor, event organizer and administrative figure, which included serving as the president for the PWBA during the 1960s and 1970s. She was elected to the position in 1965 and held the role until 1975

As a competitor, she found success on the local and state levels across Michigan and earned her time in the national spotlight with her win at the 1974 PWBA Dayton Classic in Dayton, Ohio.

After moving to Las Vegas in the late 1970s to join the staff at the famed Showboat Lanes, she continued to find the winner's circle in local and state competitions in Nevada.

In addition to her role with the PWBA, Robinson also served on the Greater Flint Area Board of Directors for 10 years, was a director and supervisor of junior bowling programs in Michigan for 20 years and helped organize tournaments and participation programs for the Special Olympics.

In Las Vegas, she helped to develop tournaments for

members of the military. In the early 1990s, she set her sights on providing female bowlers ages 50 and over the chance to compete on the national stage and created the National Golden Ladies Classic (now International Golden Ladies Classic), which continues to run each year in Las Vegas.

Robinson coached Team USA in 1967 at the Federation Internationale des Quilleurs (FIQ) World Championships (now International Bowling Federation World Championships) in Sweden, and she traveled across the world helping to conduct clinics as an ambassador of the sport through the AMF Staff of Champions.

She was recognized as the International Bowling Media Association's Rip Van Winkle Award winner in 1995, and her tireless efforts and contributions to the sport helped her earn five additional inductions to local and state halls of fame – Greater Flint Area USBC, Michigan State USBC, Greater Flint Area Sports, Southern Nevada USBC and Nevada State USBC
