

## KIA PBA ToC Begins this Week <br> The second major of the 2021 PBA Tour season will pay $\$ 100,000$ to the winner

J upiter, Fla.-The KIA PBA Tournament of Champions, the second major championship of the 2021 PBA Tour season begins this week at Bowlero Jupiter. The qualifying and match play rounds will be streamed live on FloBowling, Feb. 23-26, and the stepladder finals will air live Sunday, Feb. 28 at 1 p.m. ET on FOX Broadcast Channel.

Here are some of the top
storylines heading into the 2021 KIA PBA Tournament of Champions:

TROUP GOES FOR SECOND CONSECUTIVE MAJOR After winning his first career major title in the PBA Players Championship, Kyle Troup will attempt to win his second in as many weeks. Winning a quarter of a million dollars has already made 2021 Troup's best ever season in PBA Tour earnings. Winning
the Tournament of Champions would give Troup another sixfigure payday and make him performance-eligible for PBA Hall of Fame consideration. It would also tie him with his father, Guppy, with eight career PBA Tour titles.

DEFENDING CHAMPION SEEKS ANOTHER $\$ 100,000$ CHECK

Kris Prather won the 2019 PBA Playoffs for his first $\$ 100,000$ purse, then earned another six-figure prize last season when he won the 2020 Tournament of Champions for his first major title. With $\$ 100,000$ available to the winner again this season, Prather will be looking to further solidify his nickname: $\$ 100 \mathrm{k}$ Prather.

The Reverend Dr. C.K Moore had one of the more unique and brief careers of any PBA Tour player ever. Besides spending a couple of years in the late 1990's on tour, he had other priorities, as you can see by his title. First a pastor, then getting his doctorate in theology in the midst of a career as a Presbyterian minister.

Last week, Moore spoke about his 1996 PBA Rookie of the Year campaign, highlighted by
the ninth TV 300 in PBA his tory (Chris Via threw the 30th two weeks ago) on route to his Ione PBA title, even garnering a January 1997 Sports Illustrated article. Now 25 years later at age 63, Moore moves into the
next chapter of his life's work of teaching as head bowling coach at Hastings College in Hastings, Nebraska.

That process began at an interesting point in his life. As his youngest daughter began college, Moore was looking to retire after 40 years in the ministry. Coaching bowling was something he had always done as a side job, even helping New Braunfels High in 2012 and 2013. He thought this was the time to pursue it.

In the interview process, Hastings College officials were a little stunned to learn a pastor with a doctorate in theology had the bowling background he did. The Hastings College

student athletes did what many millennials and Generation Z'ers now do to find out about someone, they Googled him.

But there was one student athlete who didn't bother to use the internet. He asked Moore directly and got an answer that blew his mind.

M oore asked the seniors on the team to bowl league with him this season, mostly as a challenge. Some of Moore's ideas didn't mesh well at first, so he challenged them. If they could beat him, he would use some of their ideas. At the halfway point of the season, they haven't beat him yet. Moore is averaging in the mid 230 's. The student athletes are in the lower 210's.

With his bowling contacts, he wanted to bring in a name pro to give a weekend clinic at the annual Hastings Invitation al tourney in November. What struck Moore, was the response to the first pro he mentioned. He suggested Norm Duke. All he heard was crickets. These college bowlers had no idea who he is.

Then he remembered a Florida proprietor whose center he had bowled league in, A nthony Prather, proprietor of DeLuna Lanes in Pensacola, Florida, father of current PBA standout Kris Prather. This was the name the students knew
and knew well. Even after the Hastings Bronco Open was cancelled due to COVID, the 2020 PBA Tournament of Champions winner drove out anyway and provided a memory the Bronco team won't forget.
"Great kid, great game, he has all the tools and knows how and when to use them. They had a blast hanging out with him."

Coach Moore and I covered a few other topics in our chat and will cover those in a future $J P A$.

I wasn't trying to jinx anything, but when Kris Koeltzow set what I believe was the first TV appearance three-game record of 792, I thought it would last a number of years. It would last just a week (actually hours because the regional finals shows were taped immediately after the initial live show), but that's a different story.

Zach Weidman rolled over his first three opponents with the now record 803 series before dropping the PBA Players Championship Central Region final to Tom Smallwood, 246 to 226 .

Scores are to be had in the PBA Players Championship regional finals, but is it translating to higher television ratings? Perhaps the February Factor will help, which leads us into the next item.
\#\#\#\#\#\#
Am I surprised the PBA's television ratings are doing
well? Absolutely not. We all know it's a great product, yadda yadda yadda, and the three other reasons I've mentioned over the years. But one overlooked factor kicked in bigtime this month, in addition to those others.

It's February. OK, so what? Put aside the El Bizzaro week Texans and Cajuns experienced last week, as confirmed by friend of the column, Emmy winning television meteorologist J ohn Gerard, the weather in many locales, north and south, hasn't seen this long a cold spell for at least a decade.

Much of the Midwest and Eastern seaboard have also seen record amounts of snow before last week, making travel a chore having to shovel a driveway or parking lot, even to get groceries. Bad February weather traditionally has led to higher ratings because there isn't much else to do in one's leisure time

There is also a little view ership bump on the weekend after the Super Bowl, making many advertisers quite happy.

This is part of what I call The February Factor, an annual bump in viewership numbers.

February, May, August, and November are also known as "sweeps" months. Those four months are when the advertising rates are adjusted based on viewership. But now in this pandemic era, a new factor has come into play. As long as you have internet access, there are other things to do.

Average viewership for the PBA Players Championship regional finals on FS1 have been OK, but nothing jumping out as eye opening. As we have seen for nearly a year in this pandemic era, viewing habits have changed. The masses discovered live streaming ser-
vices, binge watching a favorite series, and other things to do.

The highest average viewership was to no one's surprise the week betw een the NFL conference championship games and the Super Bowl, when viewing choices are not strong. The Southwest Region finals, won by Francois Lavoie, drew an average of 287,000 viewers and a 0.19 rating. The first final, the live West Region finals won by Anthony Simonsen, drew 222,000, while the other two averaged 209,000 and 208,000 viewers on back-to-back days.

Not only did the weekend after the Super Bowl factor kick in, add in carry over view ership from an early prerace show for NASCA R's Daytona 500,
surging the average viewership for the Eastern Region finals, won by Dick Allen, to $328,000 / 65,000$ in the 18-49 age group/ 0.22 rating, according to Nielsen numbers posted on media site, show buzzdaily.com.

Should see even better numbers (closer to one million viewers, I believe) as the PBA Players Championship and the Tournament of Champions live finals air on the main Fox Network. I'll recap those in the next few weeks in JPA right here in TBN.

Tournament, which prior to the creation of the PBA Tour, was one of a select number of tournaments that top-notch bowlers would attend while making an excursion to the west coast.

My first experience at the event took place while I was still a youth bowler. Primo Liberatore, the owner of L \& L Lanes in Sebastopol, Calif., had recruited me and three of my friends to accompany him to Sports Center Bowl as scorekeepers. This was before the proliferation of automatic scoring, and the tips that we could garner were impressive and worth the trip.

This particular year was eventful in many ways. While almost every bowling center has an incredible story to tell, the circumstances involving this story were very sad; and yet looking back more than fifty years later, it has become

not only meaningful, but also paradoxical in scope.

It's hard to believe that it's been over seven years that I recounted the events of that evening, at a website called bernalwood.com. Here's my recollection from November 30, 2013:

I have many memories of Sports Center Bowl. As a youth bowler I remember coming here
with Primo Liberatore, ow ner of L \& L Lanes in Sebastopol, and a group of my youth bowling friends. We were recruited to keep score while Primo bowled in the aforementioned Washington Birthday Singles tournament.

While we were keeping score a woman allegedly came in and shot her husband, or

the Tournament of Champions three times: Mike Durbin (1972, 1982, 1984), J ason Couch (1999, 2000, 2002) and J ason Belmonte (2014, 2015, 2019). Both Couch, the only player ever to win three consecutive Tournament of Champions titles (the event was not held in 2001) and Belmonte, the all-time PBA record holder with 13 major titles, are entered in the 2021 event. If either can emerge victorious, he'll become the first player ever to win the event four times.
$\$ 1,000,000$ BONUS FOR A PERFECT GAME

For the second time this season, players will have a chance to win a $\$ 1$ million bonus by bowling a perfect game in the title match of the Tournament of Champions.
