David "Boog" Krol Wins PBA Delaware Classic for First Career Title

MIDDLETOWN, DE – On Sunday afternoon, David "Boog" Krol won the PBA Delaware Classic to become the newest first-time champion on the PBA Tour.

Krol defeated Bill O'Neill in the semifinal and Tomas Käyhkö, who also sought his first career title, in the championship match at Mid County Lanes and Entertainment in Middletown, Del.

"I dreamt of this as a kid growing up, watching these guys bowl on TV every Sunday," Krol said. "I wanted to be them, and now that I actually am, it's surreal"

Krol drove 16 hours from his home near Springfield, Mo. to Middletown. To make the main

Glenn Allison Breaks Participation Record at USBC Open Championships



Glenn Allison Celebrates 72 Years of USBC Open Participation

LAS VEGAS, NV – Numbers help to define great athletes and phenomenal achievements.

It's easy for Major League Baseball fans to associate 56 with Joe DiMaggio's hitting streak in 1941. A simple 100 written on a piece of paper reminds generations young and old of Wilt Chamberlain's prolific performance in 1962 as a National Basketball Association star.

At the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships, a 300 game, 800 series or winning total to claim a coveted Eagle lives on in the tournament's record book, now span-

Krol has been bowling the PTQ events this season, due to the fact that he is not an exempt player. This week, he drove 16 hours to Delaware to bowl seven games, where only 10 of 79 players made it into the tournament proper.

He led the PTQ, so now he's in the tournament. He bowled great during the qualifying rounds to finish 7th. From there, he defeated both Tommy Jones and EJ Tackett in best four of seven matches to qualify second for the Stepladder Finals.

In his first time on TV, and his first match, he faces Bill O'Neill, ties in regulation and wins the one-bowl roll-off. During this match he had three Brooklyns, and one nose-dive strike, all on the left lane. He also left three 10-pins on the right lane, after the "lucky" strikes on the left lane. Does that even it up...maybe, maybe not.

Now, he faces tournament leader and fellow non-champion, Thomas Kayhko. It's not the prettiest of matches for either player. The left lane was com-

pletely trash with the balls hooking as soon as they hit the lane. Krol added one more Brooklyn on the left lane, but stayed out of trouble in the other frames. 'Boog' defeats Thomas 198-170.

What impressed me the most was his composure through both matches. At no point did he have a good path to the pocket on the left lane, and even though he hit the pocket some on the right lane, it didn't strike much. He only left one split, but other than that he spared EVERYTHING.

Several 3-6-10 leaves, and multiple 10-pins. None of those are easy in any situation, but certainly not in your first TV match, and going for your first title, when it looks almost impossible to strike.

That is what winners do... whatever it takes to get the title. "Boog' earned that win as well as anyone could ever earn one.

Now did he get some fortunate breaks, he certainly did. It's pretty spectacular to get four Brooklyn strikes and a nose-dive strike in the short span of two games. That won't happen often for a top professional, especially to win a tour title.

Since the win on Sunday, So-

cial Media has been ablaze with posters making foul comments about the players' performance, and how 'below-average' these guys must be. Its not easy for the average to good bowler to understand what goes on at that level in those moments. But it's a really tough environment. For instance, EJ Tackett has made five straight stepladder finals and hasn't won any of them, I don't think that makes him a chump.

field, he had to finish top 10 in the 79-player, pre-tournament qualifier.

"I drove 16 hours to be here. I didn't want to bowl seven games in the PTQ and go home," Krol

Through five events, in which Krol advanced out of four PTQs, Krol sat 17th in points. He said he wanted to be the "PTQ player" to make the PBA Playoffs, which includes the top 16 players in competition points at the end of the regular season.

Krol will rise into the top 16 following this first-place performance — but he will not have to bowl another PTQ this season. With the title, he earned priority entry for all remaining 2024 PBA Tour events, including the World Series of Bowling XV and Tournament of Champions.

'Never in my wildest dreams would I think I would have a year like this, and hopefully this won't be the last," Krol said. "I'm going to soak it in and enjoy the moment. It hasn't hit me yet but on the car ride home, it's going

In the opening match, Delaware native Tim Foy Jr. defeated EJ Tackett, who became the first player to make five consecutive championship round appear-

A combination of lane transition and nerves got the best of Foy in the next match against O'Neill. Foy's split in the fifth frame cost him as O'Neill advanced with a clean 209.

The left lane booked about an arrow more than the right lane on the 44-foot Billy Hardwick oil pattern, which became abundantly clear in the semifinal between O'Neill and Krol.

Krol threw three Brooklyn strikes, plus a strike where the 3-pin fell forward, on the left lane alone.

Despite Krol's good fortune and a mistake of O'Neill's own in the sixth frame, leaving the 1-2-8 and then missing the headpin on the spare attempt, O'Neill could have won the match with a double in the 10th frame. Instead, he forced a tie with a strike and a nine-count spare.

Krol struck in the one-ball roll-off, while O'Neill left a 2-pin.

Keven Williams, Krol's close friend and a fellow Springfield native, supported Krol every shot of match play and the show. He gave Krol a few words of encouragement after his unconventional win over O'Neill.

You've got to be honest with your friends at that moment," Williams said. "I just told him, 'You don't deserve to be in this title match. You have one game

to show up now. Go out there, be you and leave it all out there. Don't leave this match saying you didn't fully commit. Show everyone the heart that you have."

The title match was between two non-champions in Krol and Käyhkö, both of whom grew up idolizing Finnish two-hander Osku Palermaa.

Käyhkö sought to become the third player from Finland to win on the PBA Tour alongside Palermaa and Mika Koivuniemi; Krol said Palermaa was the first two-handed bowler he saw and that validated his own twohanded game.

As both players lofted the ball, much like Palermaa himself, they continued to struggle on the left lane. However, Krol managed to stay clean while Käyhkö opened

By the 10th frame, Krol had secured his first career PBA Tour title, ultimately winning 198-170.

"The little guy has a big heart," Williams said. "He doesn't care about anything besides just being respected, and I think he's earned that respect immediately. I'm excited to see the future and see all the Boog fans that come from this."

Krol established himself as a rising talent last season. He threw 31 consecutive strikes during the 2023 PBA Wichita Classic

Anthony Simonsen Climbs Ladder to Win PBA Pete Weber Missouri Classic



Simonsen wins 4 consecutive matches to claim 14th PBA Tour title

SPRINGFIELD, MO - Fifthseeded Anthony Simonsen climbed Sunday afternoon's stepladder finals, defeating AJ Johnson, Matt Russo, EJ Tackett and top-seeded Bill O'Neill to win the PBA Pete Weber Missouri Classic.

With the win, Simonsen earned his 14th career PBA Tour title and the \$25,000 top prize.

On Friday, Simonsen threw the front-nine in the final game to punch his ticket to the finals. Following a pivotal strike, he tapped his wrist and said "too much time."

"I really had nothing to lose that last game, and that was the motto today," Simonsen said. "I barely made the show. I was on house money. Sometimes all it takes is just sneaking through until you get that opportunity."

Though he felt he had nothing to lose, Simonsen concocted a gameplan to conquer the 45foot Dragon oil pattern. His command over lanes 29-30 at Enterprise Park Lanes in Springfield, Mo. proved to be the

difference

"On TV shows, I like using balls that I'm comfortable with," Simonsen said. "I decided I was going to shuffle through a couple of those until hopefully we made the lanes dry enough to the right to throw that Attention Star. I think my gameplan today was really solid and I executed it to a tee."

In the opening match, Simonsen distanced himself from Johnson with a three-bagger in the middle of the match. Meanwhile, Johnson split three times on the

right lane — the same blunder that cost him in last week's PBA Illinois Classic title match.

Johnson advanced to face the Ione lefty in Russo, who now lives in the St. Louis area and bowls regularly with Weber during the offseason.

After a strong start, Russo left a pocket 7-10 in the fifth frame and washed out in the sixth. That was all Simonsen needed to prevail with a 247-202 victory.

The semifinals pitted Simonsen against reigning Player of the Year EJ Tackett. The 2023's season's top two players grinded through the transition as neither player struck for five consecutive frames.

Tackett tossed aside any struggles as he aced three strikes in the 10th, forcing Simonsen to double.

Just as he did on Friday evening, Simonsen dialed in when he needed it most.

O'Neill, seeking his second title of the season, awaited Simonsen in the title match.

The current front-runner for Player of the Year elected to finish on the left lane, a decision he soon came to regret. O'NeiII left a variation of the 2-10 split in the fourth, sixth and eighth frames.

Simonsen, who displayed the savviness of a fifth-year-senior

Kyle Troop Wins Just Bare PBA Indiana Classic



PBA Champion Kyle Troop - 12th Career Title

ANDERSON, IN - Kyle Troup becomes the first multi-time champion of 2024 after defeating top-seeded EJ Tackett to win the Just Bare PBA Indiana Classic at David Small's Championship Lanes in Anderson, Ind.

With a 228-213 title match victory, Troup earned his 12th career title and second of the season, moving him to the forefront of any early Player of the Year conversation. Dating

back to last season, Troup has won three of the past eight PBA Tour title events.

Just like at the U.S. Open earlier this month, Troup picked out his uniform for the show at the begnning of the week. His half-yellow, half-blue quilt print was a nod to the pants Troup's father, Guppy, wore on the 1998 Storm Flagship Open show.

Canada's Zach Wilkins defeated Mexico's Benjy Martinez in the opening match. Wilkins struck on his final eight shots to secure the match.

The 37-foot Viper pattern showed its high-scoring nature in the second match of the night between Wilkins and Troup. Troup struck on his first eight shots, then converted a 10-pin in the ninth frame — and he still needed 20 pins in the 10th frame to shut out Wilkins.

An 11-strike 279 catapulted Troup to another march to the title from the No. 3 seed.

Troup took down Marshall Kent in the semifinal, 227-224. Kent, who started the match with a gutter, did not bring his A-game that allowed him to average more than 240 this week. He missed way left three times on the left lane, going Brooklyn twice and missing the head-pin left in the 10th frame.

The title match pitted Troup against top-seeded EJ Tackett, who made his seventh consecutive top-four finish in his home state.

Troup said before the show that he felt confident if he were to win two matches and face Tackett. That confidence came,

in part, from Troup's 3-1 record against Tackett in TV finals entering the night, but also from a renewed mental strength.

Following his U.S. Open title earlier this month, Troup missed the cut in Illinois and Missouri. He regained his mental strength this week thanks to Mind Gym, a book gifted to him by Storm tour rep Jim Callahan.

Troup read the book throughout all 36 games of qualifying and elimination rounds, where he averaged more than 240 to earn the No. 3 seed. With a refined mental game, Troup's confidence has returned as well.

"We're back," Troup said. "I had good ball reaction, but I didn't have anywhere near the ball reaction I did in that U.S. Open title match. To will my way to victory, that gives me any confidence that I was lacking."

Throughout the week, players threw urethane equipment for a game or two and then jumped left with reactive equipment. On Saturday, Troup was able to throw urethane the entire night on the right lane and until the championship match on the left

ARLINGTON, Texas – The inaugural class for the United States Bowling Congress Collegiate Hall of Fame has been determined, with five inductees helping usher in a historic celebration of the sport in April 2024

Jack Connaughton of Lafayette, Indiana; Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey; and Rick Steelsmith of Wichita, Kansas, have earned induction for their on-lane performances as Student-Athletes.

Gordon Vadakin of Wichita, Kansas, will join the inaugural class in the Coach category.

Karl Nickolai of Canton, Michigan, completes the 2024 class for his dedication to collegiate bowling as a Contributor.

The ceremony for the 2024 USBC Collegiate Hall of Fame will take place April 17 during the banquet for the Intercollegiate Team Championships in Louisville, Kentucky.

Connaughton, 78, was a standout at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse (previously Wisconsin State University-La Crosse) from 1964-1968 and dominated competition across the Association of College Unions International (ACUI) and National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) ranks.

In ACUI competition, Connaughton swept the top spots at the 1967 national finals, winning singles, doubles and all-events. He returned in 1968 to successfully defend his titles in singles and all-events, while finishing fourth in doubles.

During the same two-year span at the NAIA Championship, Connaughton helped Wisconsin-La Crosse win back-to-back team titles, claimed a pair of wins in doubles competition and recorded a first-place finish in singles at the 1968 event. He finished as the runner-up in singles in 1967.

In 1966, he led Wisconsin-La Crosse to the National Intercollegiate Bowling Association (NIBA)

Connaughton, originally from Waukesha, Wisconsin, traveled to Paris, France, in 1967 as the first collegiate representative of the United States at the famed World Cup, where he captured the victory.

He has received numerous awards and honors and is a member of the NAIA, Kansas State USBC and Wisconsin State USBC Halls of Fame.

Kulick, 46, was a collegiate star at Morehead State University from 1995-1999 before ascending as one of the biggest names in the sport through her triumphs on the Professional Women's Bowling Association (PWBA) and Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Tours and as a member of Team USA.

After earning a spot as a second-team All-American from the National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association (NCBCA) her freshman season, Kulick rattled off three consecutive first-team selections. She was named the NCBCA Most Valuable Player in each of those seasons (1996-1997, 1997-1998 and 1998-1999).

Kulick also was the recipient of the International Bowling Media Association (IBMA) Collegiate Bowler of the Year award in 1997 and 1998.

Fans from across the globe have watched Kulick deliver clutch strikes to claim seven PWBA Tour titles (including five major championships) and more than 20 gold medals as a member of Team USA and Junior Team USA. In 2010, she garnered global

praise as she became the first woman to win a national title on the PBA Tour with her major victory at the PBA Tournament of Champions.

She set the stage for those moments in 1998 at the Intercollegiate Team Championships in Madison, Wisconsin. In the two-game total-pinfall championship against Central Missouri State, Kulick stepped up in a must-strike situation for the Eagles and rolled two strikes to secure the program's second national title.

Kulick was inducted to the USBC Hall of Fame in 2019 for

Superior Performance.

Steelsmith, 59, became the first four-time NCBCA first-team All-American in the men's division during his tenure at Vincennes University and Wichita State University from 1983-1987.

During his two-year stint at Vincennes, Steelsmith helped the Trailblazers win the 1985 National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) team championship. He also claimed the national singles title for NJCAA in 1985.

Making his move to Wichita State for his junior and senior

campaigns, Steelsmith continued to showcase his talent at the top level. He helped the Shockers to a third-place finish at the Intercollegiate Team Championships in 1986, earning the honor of Most Valuable Player for the all-tournament team.



In earlier years of JPA, I suggested a variety of ways professional bowling could get a bigger presence into current pop culture to gather a newer audience. These ideas range from hosting Saturday Night Live, to deejaying an MTV show (back when they were a music-only channel), being a celebrity dancer on "Dancing With The Stars," to even a home renovation show.

One scenario has occurred, the Tom Smallwood-inspired sitcom last year, "How We Roll."

So now in the latest edition of JPA's "What If" series, what if a world-famous singer and performer with a devoted following would start a relationship with a well-known professional bowler?

Possible? This might be not as far out of reality as it seems on the surface. We know high schools all across the country have bowling teams, some with talented musicians who sing or play in the marching or pep band. Here's one possible scenario.

A couple, let's call them Megan and Josh, who have known each other since high school and went their separate ways as she took off to Nashville as a singer/ songwriter, getting national exposure when she won "The Voice" with coach Gwen Stefani.

Josh got a scholarship to a college bowling powerhouse, nabbing a national championship in his sophomore year and a Junor Gold title later that summer. Before his junior year

began, he won a PBA Regional title in his first pro tournament. Midway the in the next season, he drew criticism for skipping The Hoosier Classic when the NFL asked if he would be a stadium DJ during the pregame of that year's Super Bowl. His college team suspends him for two weeks, drawing ire from his high school girlfriend, who by now has millions of followers on YouTube and TikTok after singing the National Anthem at the NBA All Star Game and the Indianapolis 500.

Once back on the team, Megan attends the collegiate national television finals to watch her new guy and her loyal fans follow her every step leading up to and including minutes before the telecast on a live TikTok stream. After his team wins, she takes the team out to a party she paid for, also seen on TikTok by a record number of viewers. Weeks later, Josh gets an exemption into a PBA Tour stop with the stepladder finals telecast on the main Fox network, wins matches over E.J. Tackett, Kyle Troup, and Jason Belmonte then falls to Anthony Simonsen who quietly sings some of Megan's song lyrics loud enough for viewers to hear, but not Josh. Megan then invites Simo on stage at her next concert several weeks later, which was also on TikTok which gets one of the biggest number of hits for

Keep in mind, this scenario is completely fictional, but who could have imagined Swifties

suddenly watching Kansas City Chiefs games just six months ago, or even imagining news breaking of a pro bowler being the focus of a network television sitcom just two years ago.

One benefit of the Taylor Swift - Travis Kelce relationship is the NFL attracted a new demographic, young Taylor Swift fans whose parents and older brothers have been viewers for years. Will this be a permanent thing? Probably not, but with the fickle world of pop culture of the moment, one never knows. One of the biggest team sports leagues on the planet got a new demographic to watch its product for free. The Kelce Brothers podcast "New Heights," various cutaways during Chiefs games, and various mentions within the sports talk media bubble, all add up, despite objections of long-time hard-core viewers seeing coverage in their eyes less focused on the game. Sound familiar? It wasn't that long ago earlier this century when PBA telecasts drew the ire of long-time core viewers earlier this century, using social media as a battle ground of opinion.

Viewers from a new demographic can bring new advertisers and with that are new forms of attention, mostly online/ streaming from the younger end since television is not their preferred form of mass media, making attracting new advertisers and attention difficult, but not impossible, as the PBA has proven in the last ten years from getting out of early Sunday afternoon fall TV times on ESPN to

more exposure on Fox, so let's see what unfolds in this TV contract takes. Moving the NFC package of games to Fox worked for the NFL thirty years ago, so there is a proven track record. Live streaming is ok and can help, but getting a million viewers to tune in to a live stream is reserved for the trendy dramas, documentaries, and occasional NFL game. Even with growing streaming numbers, network television still has the tail to wag of dog of advertisers and sponsors

Even with a portion of Swiftie Nation watching the Super Bowl, this year's game turned out to be the most viewed TV program in U.S. history. According to Nielsen, Among three broadcast outlets, the telecast averaged 123.7 million viewers, 120.3 million on CBS, 2.3 million on Univision, and 1.2 million on Nickelodeon.

By Nielsen officially adding viewers in larger viewing areas like bars, airports, and yes, bowling centers, this may add roughly 10% to the overall total. Adding those places listed above will produce a more accurate number for advertisers. Up until recently, only viewers at home have been counted.

PBA television ratings have been quite steady this season. The U.S. Open finals on February 4th averaged 762,000 viewers, a 0.46 rating, and 130,000 in the 18-49 demographic on the main Fox network. The next three tourneys on FS1 increased from the Illinois Classic (268,000, 0.15, 72,000) to the Pete Weber Missouri Classic February 10 (368,000/0.21/40,000) and the Just Bare PBA Indiana Classic (436,000/0,24/97,000) on February 24th.

With more weekly telecasts in the high-viewing time of year, there is no doubt advertisers will be happier with regular exposure. Speaking of advertisers, I'll have a review of which companies are advertising on this year's PBA telecasts on both the main Fox Network and FS1 in March.

Finally, this month, one item from bowling motion picture history is up for auction. From a movie I have "written about to death" as one of my critics once exclaimed, according to a piece in robbreport.com, the famed Red Rose ball used by the Ernie McCracken character (Bill Continued on Page 14

Pete Weber Retires — For The Second Time

I first met Pete Weber during AMF's negotiations to purchase Dick Weber Lanes from his father in Florissant, Mo., still home to most of the Weber clan. Pete was already a PBA champion at the time with a couple of titles under his belt. He was an intense young man that had heard of my 300 and 800 exploits on the east and west coast's, and was ready to duke it out on the lanes when we first met that day.

But once he learned that my personality was slightly above that of a delegate to a pacifists convention, and that I had no interest in defending my "valor" against one of the greatest bowlers in the history of bowling, we became fast friends in a mutual admiration that has continued to this day

In an article that I penned in May of 2021 ("Pete Weber — Still Doing It His Way"), I remarked about the hospitality extended to me by all of the Weber household, refusing to let me return to my hotel room, and instead enjoying home cooked meals and visits to the famous trophy room that housed all of the Weber's memorabilia. Whenever I would see Pete, usually during the U.S. Open at Carolier Lanes in New Jersey, he would always comment about how much his parents thought of me and enjoyed my company. The feeling was mutual.

Pete first announced his retirement from the regular PBA Tour in 2021. But Weber also said that he would continue to bowl the majors, or special invitations, as well as the PBA50 circuit for members over the age of 50. Ironically, Walter Ray Williams Jr., Pete's nemesis for all those years, would make virtually the same announcement a couple of days later.

In Pete's most recent announcement, he told the crowd at the PBA Pete Weber Missouri Classic, "After 44 years, it's very humbling for me to be with you today. It's been an honor and a privilege. I will continue to bowl on the senior tour, but you will never see me throw another ball on the kid's tour, the Tournament of Champions, the U.S. Open or the Masters. I love you all so much. Thank you."

In his final frame, he rolled a strike on the first ball. "Most importantly — 200," he exclaimed, pointing to the overhead scoreboard. On the next shot he left a solid 9 pin. "How appropriate, to leave a solid 9 on my last shot," said Weber. You could almost sense the sarcasm in his voice, referring to the many taps that he's had to live with the past few years. As I continued watching the telecast on Bowl-TV from Enterprise Park Lanes in Springfield, Mo., I could see the frustration that must have weighed heavily upon the 61-year-old Weber.

While Pete was leaving solid 9 pins, or 4 pins, or even the proverbial 10 pin, other bowlers around him, mostly two-handers, were striking at will, with only an intermittent 4 or 5-count split preventing them from a perfect score. There were so many 279's and 280's being rolled that it was reminiscent of playing pinball on a no-tilt machine! Only those crazy 3-4-6-7-9-10, or similar splits, were all that was preventing the players from averaging 250, or even higher. It's a wonder that Weber and Walter Ray have remained as long as they have on the regular tour. The game is just not the same.

Pete Weber won his first title at the 1982 Greater Hartford Open in Connecticut. But he didn't stop there, racking up a total of 10 titles by the tender age of 24, which is still a record. He's the only PBA player to win the Triple Crown (U.S. Open, Tournament of Champions, World Championship) twice, and he has won the U.S. Open an amazing five times.

PBA staff writer Nolan Hughes comments that since Weber's first retirement in 2021, he has bowled an occasional event each season, in addition to the majors. He has become a fixture at the PBA50 events, and last season earned PBA60 Player of the Year honors. The Pete Weber Missouri Classic will continue through Saturday, with the finals airing Sunday, February 19th at 1 p.m. Eastern, on Fox Sports 1.

"I can't wait to give the best bowler the trophy on Sunday," said Weber.

If You Can't Hit What You're Looking at, Look at What You're Hitting!

Comfort is whatever you're used to doing. Period. It's not necessarily right (or wrong); it's just comfortable. When a client is working on changing something, I often hear, "That feels uncomfortable." Well, thank goodness! You've got to change something to change something!

You have a part of your game that is your most common error. It's invariably something "comfortable," but incorrect. You'll often revert to it under pressure. You and your coach must identify whatever this is and figure a key or trigger or distracter that either prevents you from going back to that quirk or helps you identify instantly you've done it again so you can get back to the real bowler in you.

It could be that when you are tired, you slow down. Maybe when you play deep inside, you miss to the inside or send it out in the weeds. Perhaps you have a tight armswing when you

need to convert the baby split. Once these areas have been identified, you and your coach can experiment until you find a fix. Perhaps it's drinking more water (which is one of the most invigorating things you can do). Maybe it's working on different body alignments until you discover what allows you to get inside and prevents you from throwing it out in the weeds. You could shoot the bucket from every dot and every arrow until

it's a no-brainer for you.

It's a rare individual indeed who can repair their game in competition. For us Muggles, repair kits are available during lessons with our coach, not in the heat of the battle. Let's say you're pulling the ball frequently. So what? If you have a place you store the fix for that, get it out of that mental file drawer and happily proceed to "no pull" heaven. If you don't have the key to that drawer or you suspect it's empty, you don't have time to analyze and dissect why it's happening. Move to where you're pulling it! If you can't hit what you're looking at, look at what you're hitting!

This means move so that your body alignment is with the area of the lane with which you are struggling. That should, first of all, get you more comfortable. Then one of three things will happen:

- The move will fix whatever was off in your physical game and you can move back;
- You can just stay there if the move worked;
- You can keep moving if you keep pulling it.

Whatever. The point is that you not continue to stand there and pull it thinking, "On this next shot, I am going to throw it better." If you could throw it better, you would already be doing that. And another thing (you feel some finger wagging here?), you shouldn't say, "Don't pull it." That wonderful body of yours cannot not. It only hears the verbs: " pull it" and, obedient and helpful as always, it does just that.

Steelsmith put together his finest showing in 1987. He was named the NCBCA Most Valuable Player and IBMA Collegiate Bowler of the Year, again earned MVP honors at the Intercollegiate Team Championships and helped the Shockers record the team victory at the ITC.

Shortly after concluding his collegiate season, he went on to win the USBC Masters as an amateur and claimed two gold medals (trios, all-events), one silver medal (Masters) and two bronze medals (singles, doubles) for Team USA at the International Bowling Federation World Championships in Helsinki, Finland.

At the start of the 2019-2020 season, Steelsmith took over as the men's head bowling coach at Wichita State and has helped the Shockers win the 2021 and 2023 Intercollegiate Team Championships.

Steelsmith, the 1988 PBA Rookie of the Year and two-time PBA Tour champion, is a member of the NJCAA, Kansas State USBC and USBC (2013) Halls of

Vadakin, 70, was at the helm

of the Wichita State University men's and women's bowling programs from 1978-2019 and helped the Shockers claim 18 national titles between both teams.

The men's program collected 11 Intercollegiate Team Championships titles during Vadakin's tenure (1980, 1987, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1998, 2003, 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2015), and the men's team is the only program to record three consecutive wins at the ITC, having accomplished the feat two times (1993-1995 and 2008-2010).

The women's team earned seven wins at the ITC under Vadakin's watch, claiming victory in 1978, 1986, 1990, 1994, 2005, 2007 and 2009.

In all, the men's program qualified for the ITC in 37 of Vadakin's 42 years leading the program, while the women's team earned their spot in 41 of 42 attempts, advancing each year

Along with the team success, Vadakin also coached nine individual national champions (six at the Intercollegiate Singles Championships). He had 12 student-athletes claim a combined 24 NCBCA Most Valuable Player and IBMA Collegiate Bowler of the Year awards and coached 145 NCBCA All-Amer-

icans and nearly 250 academic All-Americans. At the professional ranks, Vadakin coached 17 athletes who went on to win PBA or PWBA Tour events.

In 2020, the NCBCA renamed its award to recognize the top coach in the men's division as the NCBCA Gordon Vadakin Coach of the Year Award

Vadakin, a two-time Team USA member and two-time Eagle winner at the USBC Open Championships, is a Kansas State USBC and USBC (2007) Hall of

Nickolai, 62, started his involvement in collegiate bowling first as a student-athlete at Michigan State University before taking over as the head coach of the men's program. He held the coaching spot with the Spartans for 35 years, and in 2001, became the first recipient of the NCBCA Kerm Helmer (now Gordon Vadakin) Coach of the Year

He left a lasting mark in how the sport was consumed with the launching of CollegeBowling. com in 1997. The website served as a place to view tournament results across the collegiate landscape, and it expanded over time to include rankings, statistics and player profiles.

Nickolai maintained the website until 2020, when the site became part of USBC's CollegeBowling. Bowl.com.

Nickolai was responsible for several additional items used to help rank collegiate teams and student-athletes versus the field.

In 1998, he teamed with Joe Ciccone to develop the Team Ranking System (TRS), which is an objective point-based system for ranking schools on performance in regular-season tournaments and used today to help determine sectional assignments for the four qualifying events for the Intercollegiate Team Championships.

He also introduced average differential to the collegiate bowling scene, which measures the average for a student-athlete during an event and over the season against the field of competition.

Nickolai also has given his time to the NCBCA and has been a member since 1984. He has served two separate stints as the organization's president (1992-1994 and 1998-2020) and was selected as the NCBCA Gordon Teigen Meritorious Service Award winner in 1999.

He also was recognized for his service in 2010 as the USBC Youth Volunteer of the Year and was presented the IBMA Alberta E. Crowe Meritorious Service Award in 2019.

The USBC Collegiate Hall of Fame Committee reviewed the applications to determine the members of the 2024 class. The committee is comprised of 13 individuals, featuring representatives appointed by the USBC

Collegiate Advisory Committee, USBC Hall of Fame members and veteran bowling writers. The committee only considered collegiate achievements when reviewing applications.

I'm beginning to wonder if lane conditioning has always been the defense, or the competition in bowling that Larry Bird described?

Kevin Pickens, pictured here, shot his very first 300 game in the Friday Night Mixed league.


After he shot his first 300 game, he continued into his second game, throwing a total of 24 strikes in a row to get his second 300 game.

ning 120 editions since 1901.

One number had served as the peak of tournament participation at the event since 1981, but that changed Sunday as Professional **Bowlers Association and USBC** Hall of Famer Glenn Allison became the first competitor to reach 72 years at the USBC Open Championships.

Doehrman, a USBC Hall of Famer, made his 71st appearance in 1981, while Norris, also a member of the USBC Hall of Fame, matched the mark in 2000. Thiel joined them at 71 years in

The 93-year-old right-hander received a custom trophy, plaque and chevron as he was joined by family and friends during an on-lane presentation Sunday.

Allison noted it was the first time in his 72 appearances that he was able to bowl on a team made up of all family members. He was joined on the lanes by his son (Mark Allison), daughter (Suzanne Allison), grandson (Glenn Allison II) and granddaughter (Danielle Ledezma).

"I'd just like to thank all my friends that are here to watch me break the record, and also my family," said Allison as he addressed the crowd at the Bowling Plaza. "My granddaughter, my grandson, my son and my daughter, they're all here with me on my team. This is a first for me – having all of my team members from my family. It's a wonderful feeling."

Allison's storied career at the Open Championships started at the 1947 event in Los Angeles, where he only competed in the team event. He returned to the tournament for his second trip in 1950, and since 1954, Allison has made his annual appearance each year at the event.

As his appearances started to add up at the tournament, Allison also started to collect victories at the Open Championships. He claimed four titles from 1962 through 1970.

He paired with USBC Hall of Famer Dick Hoover in 1962 to claim his first Eagle at the Open Championships, as they posted a 1,431 score to win Classic Doubles. Allison rolled a 780 series to lead the way, the highest total in his Open Championships

He followed with a pair of Classic Team victories in 1964 and 1966. He helped Falstaff Beer record the win in 1964 and Ace Mitchell Shur-Hooks take home the team title in 1966. He averaged more than 227 during team competition in those appearances.

Allison's fourth win came in Classic Singles at the 1970 event in Knoxville, Tennessee, finishing with a 730 series.

He made his 50th appearance at the 2001 tournament in Reno. Nevada, and joined the 100,000-Pin Club at the Open Championships in his 55th appearance during the 2006 event in Corpus Christi, Texas, finishing with 1,882 for the year.

As he has continued to work toward the participation record, Allison also has his eye on adding another number to his collection – the top number in career pinfall at the Open Championships.

He entered the 2024 event in third place on the all-time list at 122,954 pins, an overall average of more than 191.

Allison rolled a 301 series to start his 72nd appearance Sunday in team, and he'll return to the Bowling Plaza on Monday at 2 p.m. Pacific to see if he can get to the top spot.

He now sits at 123,255 pins for his career and is 516 pins away from passing Norris for second on the list (123,770). He needs 833 pins to surpass USBC Hall of Famer Bill Lillard Sr. for the pinfall record (124,087)
