(Roy Chesbro, Joe Lecroy, Rick Benard, Adam Pogge) in their first match 279-208.

Then defeated Team Summers (Randy Summers, Jim Stephens, Royce Rusher, Chris Johnson) 224-209 to set up the final match against Team Nichols (Bill Nichols, Phil Kepner, Derek Williams, Marshal Morrison).

Once again Team Johnson was victorius winning 267-236 for the title.

It was TJ's 12th SASBA title. Kenny's 2nd and the first for

Television ratings for the U.S. Open were some of the best of the season last Sunday, tops on FS1 for a live-finals in 2021. According to Nielsen ratings posted at showbuzzdaily. com, the two-hour show on FS1 airing from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm Central time averaged 465,000 viewers. The telecast posted a 0.30 rating and averaged 97,000 in the 18 to 49 age category, the key group aimed at by advertisers.

Consider what else was available for viewing in the two-hour block, the number is even better. The broadcast networks offered women's world figure skating championships on NBC, Masters golf on CBS, and a soccer match on ABC.

The telecast ranked 72nd

of all (not just sports) cable shows Sunday, its best ranking in several years. The last few shows concluding the World Series of Bowling XII in Match on four straight days didn't do as well as expected.

What has potential to be a great number is the viewership for the PBA Super Slam last Sunday April 18 11:30 am to 1:30 pm Central. This week's show airs on the main Fox network, which often draws the best rating for its timeslot against other channels and networks. I'll have a breakdown on that next week.

Annandale, Va.—François Lavoie bowled a 247 game in the championship match to win the Guaranteed Rate PBA Super Slam. Lavoie, who qualified for the Super Slam by winning the Kia PBA Tournament of Champions in February, defeated PBA Players Championship winner Kyle Troup to earn \$100,000. This is the most comfort-

able I've ever been on the lanes," said Lavoie. "I feel like things are coming together after working hard in the offseason. I'm feeling more comfortable and confident.'

Lavoie defeated Troup in the final match, 247-202.

My two shots into and out of the commercial break were my first sigh of relief," said Lavoie, referring to his strikes in the fifth through eighth frames. "When (Troup) didn't strike on his next two shots, I knew all I had to do was stay clean.

Lavoie struck three more

times after the eighth frame, locking up the victory.

The Guaranteed Rate PBA event featuring all five major champions from the 2021 **Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour** season, aired live on FOX **Broadcast Channel and featured** Lavoie, Troup, Tom Daugherty (Guaranteed Rate PBA World Championship), Thomas Larsen (USBC Masters) and Chris Via (U.S. Open).

"We're all bowling really well," Lavoie said of his competition. "I knew this wasn't going to be easy by any means. Coming here, I was thinking this was just going to be a fun event and we're all going to have a good time. Once we started bowling, all of a sudden I'm in competition mode and I really want to win and need to do what I can do to get through.

The Super Slam began with all five players bowling a single game. Daugherty, who bowled 179 as the lowest score, was eliminated. The other four players were seeded into the semifinals based on their first-

Another Visit With Ted Rebain

While I was rummaging through a few old files looking for some photos, I stumbled upon this article that I penned way back in 2010. While some of the information may be duplicated from the article that appeared in this journal recently regarding Ted's career in bowling ("A Lifetime of Dedication to Bowling"), there's plenty of new material to formulate another story in a revised format. So, without further ado, here's another visit with promoter Ted Rebain, from June of 2010...

After purchasing the March 15, 2010 issue of Sports Illustrated that contained an article about Tom Smallwood ("The Remarkable Story of Tom Smallwood"), the unemployed General Motors worker turned

USBC), on Saturday afternoon television ratings. Well, it should. The Masters golf tournament doesn't end until late Sunday afternoon, while Pro Bowlers Tour telecasts on ABC were mid to late Saturday afternoon. Saturday at the Masters on CBS sets up the annual mid-April Sunday afternoon drama we've seen for decades.

Bowling's U.S. Open finals was on during Sunday's final round of The Masters and on cable FS1. CBS carried The Masters as it has every year since 1956. Carry the "one" in the addition and yes, that really is 65 years.

What I really would love to see are comparisons from PBA ToC Saturdays since 1965 to final round Masters, even though the two were on the same weekend only once, in 1965.

So, what does The Masters draw on Sundays? This year's final round averaged nearly 9.5 million viewers for the fivehour long telecast

According to sportswatchmedia.com, the April 2019 Masters final round averaged 10.81 million viewers and a 6.9 rating, airing in an earlier time on that day due to severe weather. The 2018 Masters final round averaged 13.03 million and a 7.9 rating.

Another indication on the

higher PBA profile these days is coverage others in the media world are giving our little corner of the world, especially from higher profile media outlets.

The latest example is an Associated Press story appearing in a handful of major papers like the Washington Post and **Seattle Times Saturday April** 10, 2021 interviewing PBA CEO Colie Edison.

Seen in other larger market papers syndicating Post stories, many of whom stopping covering bowling altogether decades ago, carried this piece, acknowledging in a way the success the PBA has achieved on Fox Sports. Here is a link to the article from The Post.

As if that wasn't enough, Neuer's conversion was shown the next day on MLB Network's "Intentional Talk," prior to the show's signature "Got Heeem" segment show concluding segment. Co-host Stephen Nelson was more appreciative of the

Rob Stone's call, liking his enthusiasm and energy, something some of PBA audiences don't always agree. All co-host Millar could do was stare with his mouth open at the spare. MLBN's "IT" program works in a bowling mention every so

At this point, Chris Via's win may drop into the background, being this was the show with the first 7-10 split conversion since Jess Stavrook in 1991 (perhaps the last time we'll hear or read that phrase).

Crazy coincidence may be a reason, but PBA Tournament of Champions television finals in years ending in the number "1" seem to be very unique. While researching last week's 1971 finals, it dawned on me the 1981, 1991, and 2011 finals would

Johnson. Or Dusty Baker. Or perhaps a bunch of volleyball players. Which is to say that no one agrees upon the origin of high-fiving," stated Chris Ballard in the Sports Illustrated article.

Are you kidding me? As a youth involved in bowling I remember high-fiving, low-fiving, finger griping and fist pounding, to name but a few methods of transferring positive energy to the next player on the team. It was a part of bowling that had always been there, well before Magic and Dusty.

To confirm my suspicion, I called upon a friend and mentor, Ted Rebain, whose bowling resume includes just about every major chain in the bowling industry. Our afternoon together provided an interesting number of coincidences.

rank into a list of all time TV finals, each filled with drama and historic for very different reasons. Forty years ago this week was the 1981 Firestone. one of the few shows where there were not just one, but two matches you had to watch over again on your VCR.

The second match featured two-time ToC winner Earl Anthony against TV finals regular Pete Couture. The lead either had was no more than a mark, ultimately ending in a 206 to 206 tie and into the ninth and tenth frame roll-off. Then something happened that hadn't occurred since the roll-off's inception in 1961, the two were still tied after the first rolloff. In the second, Couture prevailed 60 to 40.

After the semifinal win

against Gary Dickinson, Steve Cook put an exclamation mark on this telecast with its second memorable match by absolutely flat-out dead flushing the front 10 strikes. This was one of the few tour TV finals where I honestly thought we were about to see a 300 game. At the time there had been only three prior and seven years since the last TV 300 by Jim Stefanich in January 1974.

For this week's JPA Lost Classic, we go to April 25, 1981 for another memorable Tournament of Champions TV finals found here: (https:// www.youtube.com/watch?v = Jd7sJFhoxj0&t= 3641s).

Next week, the next memorable ToC finals in a year ending in "1" in what I still call the PBA's "Heidi Game."

Ted now lives with Joan, his wife of 59 years, in the retirement community of Manchester, New Jersey. When I arrived at their home, Ted was ready with 6 file folders of information to assist us in our afternoon journey into bowling's past glory days.

The first time I saw the high-five was among black bowlers in the early 1950's at State Fair Recreation in Detroit," stated Rebain. "My father was the manager at State Fair, a 70-lane center with pin boys. It was known as 'The Bowling Showplace of the World' in those days.

Although bowling was slow to integrate black bowlers into competition, Ted's father always invited them to bowl at State Fair in his "Automobowl" tournament in the spring, and the "Detroit News Motor Bowl" tournament in the fall.

"Lafayette Allen brought his Allen's Super Market team, and that's when I first saw the high-

five," said Ted. He was quick to rattle off the members of the team as if it were yesterday: Bill Rhodman, Maurice Kilgore, Len Griffin, George Williams and C.W. Williams.

Acceptance into the ABC tournament came soon after appearances at State Fair, when the "caucasian only" clause was lifted in 1950, and Allen's Super Market became the first black team to bowl in the 1951 national event at St. Paul, Minnesota.

Ted went to work for Lincoln Mercury (and later General Motors) right out of high school but continued to assist his father on weekends at State Fair. When he was laid off by General Motors in 1957, Ted decided to accept a position with the American International Bowling Corporation (AIBC) in Pennsylvania.

"Lloyd Ludwig, whom I knew from Royal Recreation in Detroit, had been made the president of AIBC, and

Field Set for 2021 Intercollegiate **Team Championships**

ARLINGTON, Texas - The teams competing at the 2021 Intercollegiate Team Championships were determined this weekend through four sectional qualifying events.

The ITC will welcome 16 men's teams and 16 women's teams to the Spectrum Entertainment Complex in Wyoming, Michigan, to determine the champions in each division for the 2020-2021 United States **Bowling Congress Collegiate** season. The 2021 edition will be held May 5-8.

The teams advancing to the ITC were determined through four sectionals held Saturday and Sunday in Addison, Illinois; Dayton, Ohio; Smyrna, Tennessee; and Dallas. The top four teams in each division, based on total pinfall for 40 Baker games, earned the chance to compete for the Kerm Helmer Cup awarded to the team champion at the ITC.

Each sectional qualifier was broadcast live on BowlTV.com.

In Addison, Calumet rolled to the top of the men's standings after a dominant performance Sunday at Stardust Bowl, averaging more than 223 per game to jump from fourth place to the lead with an 8,376 total. William Penn finished second with 8,211, Indiana Tech placed third with 8,090 and Mount Mercy earned the final spot with 7,958.

In the women's division, Mount Mercy captured the sectional title with a 7,819 total. They'll be joined in Western Michigan by Baker (7,632), Lincoln Memorial (7,608) and Wisconsin-Whitewater (7,587).

The Dayton sectional was contested at Poelking Lanes South, with Wisconsin-Whitewater recording the win with

an 8,066 total. Pikeville (7,805), Lawrence Tech (7,777) and St. Ambrose (7,676), which started Sunday's round in seventh place, also advanced.

Delaware State claimed the women's title in Dayton, finishing with a 7,821 total. Monmouth was second with 7,607, and Lawrence Tech and St. Ambrose earned the final advancing spots with 7,512 and 7,410, respectively.

In Smyrna, Webber International, the defending ITC champion, posted the largest winning total of the four sectionals, earning the top spot in the men's field by 289 pins with an 8,301 total. Emmanuel (8,012), McKendree (7,854) and St. Francis-Illinois (7,634) also advanced from Smyrna Bowling

The singles event was contested at each of the sectional sites Friday, with the top 24 men and top 24 women advancing based on six-game pinfall totals. Each sectional took the top six players from each division.



he offered me a job with the Birnbaum brothers, owners of AIBC. I was to be the general manager for the state of Pennsylvania, with bowling centers in Allentown, Bethlehem, Lancaster and Pittsburgh," commented Rebain.

But when the automatic

pinsetter became popular, Ted's job description changed overnight. He was transferred to Manchester, Connecticut (not to be confused with his current retirement home in Manchester, N.J.), where he spent the most enjoyable time of his life opening new bowling centers.

Once again, Ted rattled off the names of the new centers as though it happened yesterday: Parkade Lanes in Manchester.

CT; Plaza Lanes in Haverhill, MA; Airway Lanes in Springfield, MA; Foxfield Lanes in Foxboro, MA; Stadium Lanes in Plainville, CT; Colony Lanes in Wallingford, CT; Walnut Hill Bowl in Woonsocket, RI; and Maple Lanes in Marlboro, MA. For many of the grand openings, Ted reached back to friends that he had made while growing up in Michigan, including superstars Marion Ladewig and Bob Strampe.

Ted remained general manager of the Middle Atlantic Region until AIBC merged with Brunswick in 1965, to form the early nucleus of Brunswick Recreation Centers (BRC) in the United States. When Ludwig decided to leave after the promotion of Bernie Rudo to president of the combined organization, Ted also contemplated leaving the chain.

But before Rebain could pack his bags, Rudo offered Ted a position as general manager of Yonkers Bowl in New York, with no reduction in pay. It was during this time that BRC developed the "Bowl Your Way To Europe" tournament, and placed Ted in charge of the national event.

"Even though he was just a center manager, he was completely in charge of the Bowl Your Way To Europe tournament every spring in Washington, D.C.," said Mrs. Rebain.

"And when anyone complained, Mr. Rudo would say to them: Ted's the only one that's had any experience running tournaments, so do what he says!"


