



## A.J. Chapman Wins PBA FireLake/Grand Casino Resort Southwest Open

SHAWNEE, OK - A.J. Chapman, from Manchester, Iowa, now living in Lewisville, Texas

won his fourth PBA regional title Sunday, May 2 in the tenth annual PBA FireLake/Grand Casino Resort Southwest Open.

Chapman, climbed into the lead in the eight game modified round robin finals by winning five of the first seven matches. Chapman defeated qualifying leader Ildemaro Ruiz in the seventh game 223-204 to set up the position round match against Sean Lavery-Spahr, of Pasadena, Texas. With 30 bonus pins for winning each match, and Chapman holding only a 15 pin lead, the winner of the last game would be the champion. Chapman answered the challenge defeating Lavery-Spahr 245-212 allowing him to claim the \$5,000 first place prize.

The Big Brother/Big Sister Pro-am portion of the tournament was held on Friday evening. The annual fund

raiser was again a big success, reportedly raising over \$30,000 for the charity.

The PBA Southwest Region visits Hilltop Lanes in Waxahachie, Texas, May 21-23, for the PBA Waxahachie Southwest Challenge, a non-champions event.

### Pete Weber - Still Doing It His Way

Ralph Waldo Emerson once said, "To be yourself in a world that is constantly trying to make you something else is the greatest accomplishment." And so it is with Pete Weber, the on again, off again superhero of professional bowling, who won again for the second consecutive week at the Granville Financial Open at Sandhills Bowling Center in Aberdeen, North Carolina, the latest stop on the PBA50 Senior Tour.

The list of accomplishments for Pete Weber on the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Tour are too numerous to mention, including 37 titles on the regular tour and eleven on the senior circuit. But the statistic that stands out for me is his domination of the major events in both the regular and

senior divisions of the PBA. No other bowler, with the possible exception of Don Carter, has so dominated the men's majors in any era of bowling history.

My first meeting with a young Pete Weber took place during AMF's negotiations to purchase Dick Weber Lanes, the Florissant, Missouri home

in the Intercollegiate Singles semifinal loss to North Carolina A&T's Ana Olaya, Kulick explained the difficulty in what a player goes through in a regular match play with other activity in the center versus a match on television when there are only two players, and the pace is much faster physically and mentally.

Two visual differences were showing things in a way not considered proper television technique. This involves the handheld camera beside the left-hand lane and a rare camera angle. In traditional television, showing other camera locations for any length of time is not considered sound technique, looking amateurish. The handheld camera shown on every shot of a player on the approach ready to toss the next ball was in place to show an uncustomary camera angle. In basic video composition, the ideal movement of a moving object within the frame is left to right. All we saw for years on ABC's Pro Bowlers Tour was this left to right movement as the ball heads down the lane moving from the viewers

perspective left to right.

Instead, this handheld camera showed a right to left movement on replays of live shots just seen live from left to right. From a serious player or to a casual viewer, it is definitely eye-catching. We'll have to see what happens during the ITC telecasts when an entire team is standing on an adjacent approach. It is a novel idea whose time may have come.

I'll have more once both the Intercollegiate Team Collegiate (ITC) women's and men's final air in the coming weeks.

In the Metroplex, there have been a fair share of PBA players and legends whom we've gotten to know fairly well over the years. We have lived through their triumphs and not so good days together on national television, knowing we had truly seen something special and memorable. An example of these two would be Norm Duke's first tour win at age 19 in 1983 and Del Ballard losing a title on his infamous gutter ball in 1991.

Imagine a PBA Tour win so strange, with not only the usual twists and turns, not only did it feature all sorts of breaks at just the right time over four stepladder matches, but it literally saved a pro's career right then and there. Well, it actually happened a long, long time ago in a time zone far, far away in this week's JPA Lost Classic.

Every Cinco de Mayo, I can't help but think of my

fateful interview with the one and only Charlie Tapp. One of the few native Minnesotans to venture out on the PBA Tour in the 1980's, Tapp had his downs, and a few more downs. Up until his first tour win in Seattle against Wayne Webb in June 1983, his memorable low was just six months earlier, a heartbreaking loss to Toby Contreras in Alameda, which followed the historic 1982 loss to Earl Anthony as Anthony passed the \$1 million mark in career earnings.

When I heard Tapp and Joe Hutchinson were bowling for a fundraiser at the St. Cloud State student union weeks after my SCSU bowling career ended, it was a no brainer what to do. So on that first Saturday in

May after Tapp bowled his first PBA Firestone Tournament of Champions, a charming and delightful college TV reporter introduced himself to Tapp and had a 30 minute chat.

Yes, I have chronicled that chat a few times here in JPA, but the next bend in the road didn't take place for five more years. As Tapp explained in a 2019 trip down memory lane about my first bowling story, it was his out of the blue 1989 PBA Greater Hartford Open win that gave him additional time on tour.

By early 1989, he hadn't won that second title yet, the sponsor money dwindled, so he was out on tour on his own. A week before his win was a

10th place finish in Baltimore, offering a little confidence, but nothing huge. The confidence boost would come in front of a few million people, as Tapp explains.

"Having the sponsor, Marli's 100% support (then fiancé, now wife of over 30 years) and I knew I was bowling well, I just needed something good to happen to give me some confidence. The week before Hartford I finished 10th in Baltimore. On the following Monday night in Hartford, Marli's, Ernie Schlegel and myself practiced. He showed me a couple of different ways to play lanes when they got crappy and nothing else

of Pete's famous father. The usual procedure that AMF employed was to have me visit a potential acquisition for a week to get a feel for the business, the clientele, and to verify the league bowling information that had been sent by visual observation every evening.

Pete, who was already a PBA champion with a couple of titles under his belt when we first met, was an intense individual that was familiar with my 300 and 800 exploits, and seemed to want to duke it out on the lanes that day. But once he realized that my personality was slightly above that of a delegate to a pacifist's convention, and that I had no interest in defending my record against one of the greatest bowlers that the world has ever known, we became fast friends in a relationship of mutual admiration that has continued to this day.

During that week I was wel-

comed into the Weber household and experienced midwestern hospitality on more than one occasion with home cooked meals and a visit to the famous trophy room that housed all of the Weber's bowling memorabilia. Dick also made it clear to a couple of his sons, Pete and John, that my association with them could be beneficial once the bowling center transaction was complete.

He was right! John became a Bowling Activities Representative for the midwestern region of AMF Bowling Centers, a position that he would hold for a couple of years before deciding to accept a position with the PBA; and Pete became one of the most sought after professional kglers for exhibitions on the AMF Staff of Champions - second only to his father in popularity.

My fondest memory of Pete's celebrity appearances took place at AMF Anderson Bowl, in Anderson, South Carolina. While Dick Weber was by far the most polished of the AMF

staff of bowlers and clinicians, I found myself booking Pete more and more often because of his flamboyant style and tournament performances. In view of the fact that Pete was very comfortable with match play competition, we came up with a doubles competition that he enjoyed, as opposed to the normal bowling clinic format.

Under the unique format that was first introduced by manager Mike O'Barr of Anderson Bowl, the team of Pete Weber and Dave Williams was pitted against many of the top-flight bowlers in the area,

## Open Championships Weekly Glance

Nine bowlers celebrate milestones at 2021 USBC Open Championships

As expected, the initial days of competition at the 2021 United States Bowling Congress Open Championships in Las Vegas have featured frequent lead changes in all three average-based divisions, but a handful of longtime bowlers also have earned some time in the spotlight at the South Point Bowling Plaza.

Five bowlers have been recognized for 50 years of USBC Open Championships participation, while USBC Hall of Famer Bob Hart of Suwanee, Georgia,

added his name to the short list of competitors who have competed 65 times.

Hart's milestone march to the lanes came May 5, and he became the 15th bowler in 117 years of Open Championships competition to reach the 65-year mark. He received a plaque, chevron and custom ring.

The 83-year-old right-hander entered the year eighth on the event's career pinfall list and added 1,230 pins to his total with sets of 414 in doubles (with his son Robert), 411 in singles and 405 in team. His new total is 111,366.

The list of bowlers who



celebrated 50 appearances includes Robert Montgomery of Erie, Pennsylvania; Barry Gulden of Hanover, Pennsylvania; William Matthews of Kalispell, Montana; Jeff Baumann of Yorkville, Illinois; and Tony Maresca of Mesa, Arizona.

To commemorate their five decades on the championship lanes, each bowler received a plaque, chevron and diamond lapel pin.

Additionally, Fran Eighme of Waterloo, Iowa, and Charles Tredway of Chester, New Jersey,

as well as local television and radio personalities. One team that did not stand out at the time, but that eventually won the competition, was the team of J.D. Hayworth and Mike Seidel of WYFF-TV Channel 4 in nearby Greenville, South Carolina.

You might recognize those names... J.D. Hayworth went on to a successful career in the United States Congress as a representative from Arizona, and for many years hosted a show on Newsmax-TV called Newsmax Prime. Not to be outdone, Mike Seidel has been your voice for extreme weather reports on The Weather Channel for almost 30 years. Now, you might be wondering how this team of amateurs could ever beat the formidable team of Weber & Williams in a match without any handicap?

There's a couple of reasons that Pete and I received a particularly polished pasting at the hands of Hayworth & Seidel. You see, the night before the event, O'Barr and his staff screened and coated the wooden lanes, and installed new "flat-bottom" pins. Needless to say, the scores rolled were substantially below expectations, but in spite of that embarrassing moment, Pete and I both carried on with a bowling segment that followed the celebrity bowl-off.

And now, after 42 years on the PBA Tour, Pete is calling it quits. However, he will still be around for the PBA50 Senior Tour, and some of the regional events hosted by the PBA. In an emotional interview on Flo-Bowling earlier this year, Pete Weber was philosophical and characteristically candid when he stated, "Whether you hated me, or you loved me - you watched, and I love you all." 

were introduced as the newest members of the tournament's 55-Year Club, for which they each received a plaque, chevron and engraved watch.

The final milestone of the event's opening week featured Jamie Brooks of McKinney, Texas, who became the 24th member of the 100,000-Pin Club.

Brooks entered the 2021 Open Championships needing 381 pins to cross the coveted plateau. The 86-year-old right-hander rolled sets of 485 in singles, 460 in doubles and 440 in team for a 1,385 all-events total. His career pinfall for 61 years stands at 101,004.

Five bowlers roll perfect games at South Point

Through 11 days of competi-

tion at the 2021 USBC Open Championships, five bowlers have rolled perfect games on the tournament lanes. Four were recorded during singles at the South Point Bowling Center, and the fifth was posted during team play at the South Point Bowling Plaza.

Timothy West of Westport, Connecticut, was the first to break through, doing so May 2. Jeffrey Sisson of Marion, Ohio, followed suit later the same day, and Douglas Heimons of St. Louis added his name to the list on the final squad of the day May 3. Wayne Fleming Jr. of Hackettstown, New Jersey, ended a short drought when he connected for a 300 game May 7.

Jeffrey Campbell of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, whose father, James, is a 2004 Team All-Events champion, became the first bowler to achieve per-

fection during the team event. The right-hander accomplished the feat May 10.

Since 2013, competitors at the Open Championships have faced the ultimate test of versatility in the form of two lane conditions each year.

In 2021, more than 38,000 bowlers will face the challenge across two bowling centers for the first time in tournament history. All team competition is being held at the South Point Bowling Plaza, while doubles/singles squads are taking place at the South Point Bowling Center.

The Bowlers Journal Championships presented by USBC, the premier side event for Open Championships bowlers, also saw its first 300, as local standout Matthew Anderson used the perfect performance to find his way to the top of the standings in Open Singles (738) and Open Doubles (1,453 with

AJ Chapman of Double Oak, Texas).

Anderson, the brother of 2018 USBC Masters winner Andrew Anderson, owns a 300 at the Open Championships, too (2014). Andrew matched the feat in 2019.

Wisconsin bowler early front-runner at 2021 Open Championships

Todd Fenske of Wausau,

Wisconsin, turned in the best overall performance of his 24 years at the USBC Open Championships and helped set the early standard for the tournament's most coveted category, Team All-Events. He also leads Regular Singles and Regular All-Events.

The 45-year-old right-hander cruised into the lead in Regular



worked. I used them during qualifying and put together a great run to make the finals and ended up making the show and winning. He called me at the bowling center the second after the show ended and it was quite the conversation."

The missing part two years ago was a tape of the show, especially the final match.

I normally leave this to you to watch on your own, but I have yet to see another strikefest like this one Tapp put together in the title match against Steve Cook.

On the left lane, Tapp had a Brooklyn, 4-6-7 split, a snowplow strike, and another Brooklyn in Frames 2, 4, 6, and 8. The right lane was a little easier. Strikes were Brooklyn, Flush, half pocket snap the dime strike, wall shot, and a dead flush strike in Frames 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9. After nine frames, Tapp had a seven-pin lead with a max score of 265.

Meanwhile, Cook was tossing strikes with very active pin reaction common today, very uncommon in the late 1980s urethane era. His eighth frame strike somersaulted the head pin back into the right side of the rack, the ninth frame strike offered a messenger strike with the head pin taking out the 7-pin.
