

If you didn't think there were enough bowling news stories to digest lately, hold my beer. Mid-May is the time of year television networks had series orders out for the upcoming fall season's shows, the USBC Queens crowned a new champion, and the Kia PBA Playoffs had strong television ratings.

According to hollywoodreporter.com and tvline.com, two entertainment industry news organizations, the Tom Smallwood sitcom named "Smallwood" has been given a series order by CBS-TV for its 2021-22 fall schedule, announced by the network Friday May 14.

Several weeks ago, news broke about a pilot episode being ordered. A series order is

Kyle Troup Wins KIA PBA Playoffs for Eighth Career Title

Milford, Conn.—Top seed Kyle Troup defeated No. 11 seed Sam Cooley to win the 2021 Kia PBA Playoffs, 3-1, in a raceto-three-points competition, in which each game is worth one point. Troup's second Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour title of the season is also the eighth

of his career. With the \$100,000 first-place prize, Troup has now earned a single-season PBA Tour record \$469,200 in 2021.

Troup won the first game, then fell victim to Cooley rolling the 31st televised perfect game in PBA Tour title-event history, knotting the match at one point apiece.

'I felt really confident," said Troup of his mindset entering game three despite Cooley having rolled 300. "I knew I pretty much lost that game by the seventh or eighth frame, so I switched my focus to rooting Sam on. I wanted to see him bowl 300 and get the extra \$10,000. It's one to one, all right, I just need to win a game. I really wanted to win game three to put the pressure on him to make him feel like it was a must-win situation.

Troup did win game three, taking advantage of an open frame from Cooley in the seventh after Troup had also

"I was frustrated about the bad break," said Troup of missing the 9 pin. "I flagged it. I had to get myself refocused. Once I did that, I was okay."

Troup doubled in the 10th to clinch game three and take a 2-1 lead entering the fourth

"I felt like I bowled a fantastic game four," said Troup. "The lanes were just toast. They were ugly.

Troup struck on his first Continued on Page 7



The More Things Change, The More They Stay The Same

While working on an article for BCM Magazine, I stumbled upon a PBA Tour Program Yearbook in my "mini-storage warehouse bowling museum" that had become separated from my 38-year collection of annuals. Every year the PBA would provide to each member a new copy as part of the \$300 annual fee for membership, assuming that you also maintained the necessary criteria to be a part of this very elite group of traveling vagabonds.

The yearbook was from 1975, my very first year of membership in the PBA. As I perused the pages, a thought came to me that I have quoted often in my life - "The more

things change, the more they stay the same." The phrase is most often credited to Jean-Baptiste Alphonse Karr, an educator, writer and floriculturist from France that lived during the 19th century.

While major sponsors have always been important to the PBA members and their existence, the names have changed considerably. Thumbing through the first few pages there are full page advertisements from most of the individual tournament sponsors: Midas, Showboat Hotel, King Louie Apparel, Monroe Shock Absorbers, Ford Motor Company, Ebonite, AMF,

good and remain steady. CBS will order more episodes. If not, the show may last only a few weeks.

Pete Holmes (Last seen in "Crashing") will star as Tom Smallwood, Chi McBride (Hawaii Five-O) will star as a bowling center owner and mentor to Smallwood. According to variety.com, Katie Lowes (Scandal) will also star as Smallwood's wife.

Michigan native and Tony award nominated stage actor Brian d'Arcy James (Hamilton) will be an executive producer, has been behind the project for some time, and is very familiar with Smallwood's story. According to both Hollywood Reporter and TV Line, "Smallwood" was one of several new shows in the front running for a series order on CBS. The number of episodes ordered was not disclosed, but keep in mind many primetime shows for the fall season begin shooting scenes in July and August for September or October pilot episode airing.

Fellow Motiv Bowling staffer Tom Smallwood will have "behind the scenes involvement" as a technical advisor. I asked Smalls last week about his reaction to part of his life being the premise to a television sitcom.

"I don't have much involvement with it really. I talk to

the writer a few times a week. I'm supposed to fly out when they start taping the first show, but that's not until August. It's funny. This is a show based off my life, but I don't know a lot about it. I'm sure I will be in contact with them more often now. It's still crazy and I won't really believe it until it airs on CBS," the 2009 PBA World Champion said.

Smallwood and PBA Commissioner Tom Clark confirmed to JPA the PBA would "help out in anyway." Motiv Bowling hasn't responded to my inquiries about their possible involvement with equipment and product placement.

The show is already posted on cbs.com under the "Comedies" tab with this description.

'Here's the thing Tom Smallwood (Pete Holmes) knows about bowling: You get two chances. No matter what you do with the first ball, you get another roll to make it right. A story of the ultimate second chance, Smallwood tells of a Detroit assembly-line worker who, with the consent of his loving wife (Katie Lowes). decides to turn an unexpected layoff into a dream-fulfilling new job as a pro bowler. Based on the true "modern-day Michigan fable" of three-time PBA Tour winner Tom Smallwood."

Not quite sure about the conventional grip Holmes uses in the photo, but Smallwood added he

will have something to say about that. I'll have other com-

ments from Tom as this first of its kind trip

into a regular network primetime sitcom.

There have been a few feature films featuring bowling over the years like Michael J. Fox in "Greedy," "The Big Lebowski," and of course, "Kingpin." There was the David Letterman produced drama/ comedy "Ed," centered around a bowling center in the early 2000's, but not a sitcom loosely based on the life of a professional bowler.

with an incredible assist from Bowlero, the mammoth bowling center conglomerate that's obviously underwriting the whole process.

What I found most interesting were the player profiles near the center of the publication. Missing from the prominent players were both Pete Weber and Walter Ray Williams Jr., who had not yet begun their illustrious careers. The top player in earnings was Earl Anthony, who had just come off his best year in 1974,

with five titles and a total of \$96,160 in earnings.

Earl's total may not seem like a lot compared to the numbers being flashed about today. At last count, Kyle Troup had earned \$469,000 so far in 2021, eclipsing the one-year record total of \$419,700 set by Walter Ray Williams Jr. in the 2002-2003 season. However, if you adjust Earl's winnings from 1974 for inflation, that amount equates to \$541,245 (dollartimes.com). Walter Ray's

Open Championships Weekly Glance

Two bowlers roll perfect games, lead events at 2021 SBC Open Championships

Team USA member Michael Martell of Brooklyn, New York, and Adam Chase of Ronkonkoma, New York, rolled the sixth and seventh 300s of the 2021 United States Bowling Congress Open Championships, respectively, and used that momentum to also find the top of the leaderboards.

Martell's perfect game May 14 came in the third game of his tournament career and capped a 736 series during his team event at the South Point Bowling Plaza.

The 23-year-old left-hander showed his versatility by turning in similar performances during doubles and singles on a second oil pattern at the nearby **South Point Bowling Center** on May 15. He added 750 in

singles and 708 in doubles to take the lead in Regular All-Events with a 2,194 nine-game

Chase, a 33-year-old right-hander making his 11th **USBC** Open Championships appearance, started doubles May 17 with a 300 game and maintained his look through six games, ending the day with 247, 259 and 259 for a 765 series and the lead in Regular Singles.

While Chase was stealing the spotlight with his string of strikes, Wisconsin's Jonathan Schalow and Chad Svendsen. both 36-year-old right-handers, were putting themselves in position for a run at the Regular Doubles lead, and they got there with a huge final game.

In the finale, Schalow rolled the first 298 of the 2021 Open Championships, leaving a 3-10 split on his final shot, and



Svendsen bowled a 246 game for a 544 finish and 1,436 total.

Schalow led the overall doubles effort with a 766 series, and Svendsen added 670.

Six bowlers celebrate milestones at South Point Bowling

The 50-Year Club at the **USBC Open Championships** grew by six members this week, and each competitor received a plaque, chevron and diamond lapel pin to commemorate the milestone.

James Hamen of Chicago was the first to add his name to the list, taking the lanes at the South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas on May 13 with his sons Matthew and Daniel by his side. The 81-year-old made his tournament debut at the

has see before. Yes, even better than a mention by name on a Chuck Lorre Vanity Card. #####

Since I wrote the headline and press release for the January 2021 IBMA Bowler of the Month, I'll use it part of it again. That's Bond, Julia Bond who is your 2021 USBC Queens tiara owner. Am I surprised? No. not really and here's why.

The answer came from now retired University of Nebraska head women's coach Bill Straub to a question I asked after the Lady Huskers won the 2017 Sam Houston State Kat Klash about Bond, its anchor bowler that season. The video isn't up at the moment, but here's a transcript.

Me: Your anchor Julia Bond had experience with Junior Team USA, bowling overseas and medaling. Have you seen a difference in her game, perhaps getting even stronger?

Straub: She's becoming more independent. It's sounds like when we always say Nebraska's way or the highway if you don't do what I want you to do. I try to breed independence, she's getting very independent, she tells me when I'm wrong, which I want to hear.

We may have seen the first major win for the PWBA's next big name.

######

More sponsors and steadily higher viewership ratings. When was the last time PBA viewers heard those two things in the same sentence? If I were to offer a guess, it may be since Bruce Willis was singing about Seagram Golden Wine Coolers when it sponsored the U.S. Open in the late 1980's and were a frequent advertiser on ABC's Pro Bowlers Tour telecasts.

As promised last week, the Kia PBA Playoffs Nielsen ratings are in with very steady average viewership numbers. Starting with the April 24 - 25 opening weekend, the average viewership ranged between a low of 158,000 for the Saturday May 1 show to a FS1 aired high the next day of 456,000. The Sunday May 16 finals on the main Fox network, or as lead announcer Rob Stone referred to it on Saturday's semifinal show, as "Bart Simpson Fox" and "Family Guy Fox," two of the highest rated shows currently on the Fox Network.


In a message from PBA Commissioner Tom Clark, the Saturday morning semifinal drew an average of 281,000 viewers (no other numbers were available). The Sunday finals averaged 670,000 and offered quite the range, since ratings are measured every fifteen minutes, then averaged.

Clark said the 1:00 pm Central show started with 489,000 viewers, then ended at 3:00 pm Central with 884,000 watching and was about the same as the 2019 PBA Playoffs. Both 2019


semifinals and finals both aired on the main Fox network, averaging 576,000 and 662,000 viewers, respectively.

This year at the South Point Bowling Plaza and South Point **Bowling Center, Conley rolled** sets of 508 in team, 505 in doubles and 465 in singles for a 1,478 all-events total. In 50 years on the tournament lanes, the 72-year-old right-hander has knocked down 80,303 pins for a career average of 179.6.

Ronald Griffis of Susquehanna, Pennsylvania, and Denny Bluck of West Lafayette, Ohio, made their milestone marches at the Bowling Plaza on May 15, while Bill Fillman of Muskogee, Oklahoma, and Pat Cornell of Beach Park, Illinois, followed suit on May 17.

This year on the championship lanes, Griffis rolled sets of 488 in team, 461 in singles and 414 in doubles for a 1,363 all-events total. In 50 years Continued on Page 6

player joins the elites of the game. In a regular job, it's better known as "paying your dues." Mark Roth provides a perfect example. The talented right handed bowler from New Jersey had five years under his belt at the time of the PBA publication in 1975, and showed a gradual improvement each year: 1970-\$1,132; 1971-\$2,520; 1972-\$12,103; 1973-\$19,900; 1974-\$35,779.

And yet, there are exceptions to this rule. Appearing next to Roth in the yearbook is Eddie Ressler, a nineteen-yearold from Allentown, Pennsylvania. In only his second year on the tour, Eddie had claimed his first title in the Winston-Salem Classic at Major League Lanes in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Another exception outlined in the 1975 yearbook is Mike Durbin, who won two titles in his inaugural season of 1967 on the PBA Tour (Tampa, Florida and Youngstown, Ohio), and a total of \$23,035 in earnings (adjusted for inflation, that would equate to \$182,371

today).

Durbin never seemed happy on the tour, often expressing his displeasure with the extensive travel. He originally hailed from Burbank, California, where his parents owned a six-lane bowling center. Over the years, Mike tried his hand at managing a very large bowling center for Don Carter in the Fort Worth area, then spent a brief time as the PBA50 Senior Tournament Director, and finally found his niche when he teamed with Denny Schreiner to form what is arguably the greatest broadcast team that

bowling has ever known.

Another similarity that I noticed while thumbing through the pages of the 1975 Yearbook is in the scheduling of televised events. In 1975 the winterspring events were televised on ABC, which originally began in 1962 as part of ABC's Wide World of Sports. Then in 1974, Home Box Office (HBO) began airing the PBA's Summer Tour with a slate of ten telecasts (ESPN did not begin television broadcasts until 1979, and aired their first PBA event in 1985). Today, it is Fox and Fox Sports (FS1) that have taken the reigns of the PBA telecasts with phenomenal results.

It's too bad that Mike Durbin isn't still competing on the PBA50 Tour. Since most of the events are now broadcast from just a few locations, and then rebroadcast at a later date, one of his major complaints about the travel has been

eliminated. And no one was better at framing a shot, and making the same delivery over and over, once he was lined up at one of the tour stops. I'm not sure about Mr. Durbin's health, or even his whereabouts, but if there's anyone that could make a comeback at the age of 80, that person would be Mike

Cornell, who also has a career average in the 190s, had 573 in singles, 563 in doubles and 557 in team for a 1,693 total. In 50 years at the Open Championships, the 70-year-old left-hander had toppled 86,986 pins for a career average of 193.3


